SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT FUNDS FROM AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE SOUTH FLORIDA EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING CONSORTIUM FOR FUNDING AS A SERVICE PROVIDER FOR DISLOCATED WORKERS, REIMBURSABLE COST PERIOD, DECEMBER 1, 1999 – JUNE 30, 2000

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of 1998 and Florida Senate Bill 1566 of 1999, require that state and local workforce development efforts be concentrated in the following four strategic areas: (1) Youth Programs, (2) Welfare to Work, (3) High Skills/High Wages, and (4) One-Stop Career Centers.

The Job and Education Partnership and the South Florida Employment and Training Consortium (SFETC) approved funding for Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) to establish Individual Training Accounts (ITAs) for dislocated workers. M-DCPS currently has another contract with SFETC in the amount of \$248,472 serving dislocated workers.

The WIA specifies that all Title I adult and dislocated worker training services shall be funded through the use of ITAs, which make it possible to access approved training programs provided by eligible service providers. As an eligible service provider, M-DCPS will use funds in the amount of \$71,900 to cover training costs such as part-time personnel, fees, books, and supplies.

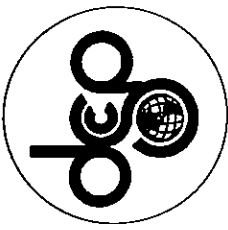
Official notification relative to this grant award was received on March 10, 2000, which is after the start of the budget period. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from December 1, 1999.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept funds from and to enter into a contractual agreement with the South Florida Employment and Training Consortium, in the amount of \$71,900, for funding as a Service Provider for dislocated workers, reimbursable cost period, December 1, 1999 – June 30, 2000; and
2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
