SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS FOR APPLICATION NO. 00-298, ROBERT BOREK, TRUSTEE ET AL., FOR A VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION IN ADDITION TO EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IMPACT FEES

Robert Borek Trustee, et al, (applicant), is requesting a district boundary (land use) change from GU (Interim) to PAD (Planned Area Development) for 57.5 acres located South of S.W. 248 Street, north of the Florida Turnpike and between S.W. 117 Avenue and S.W. 122 Avenue (see attached location map). The proposed development of 342 units is consistent with the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP) and is within the Urban Development Boundary.

The estimated student population generated by this application is 214 students. Schools impacted are Pine Villa Elementary School (116 students - permanent utilization of 129%), Redland Middle School (51 students - permanent utilization of 118%), and Homestead Senior High School (47 students - permanent utilization of 106%). The impacted feeder patterns are Homestead Senior High School, with an overall feeder pattern utilization of 123%, Miami Southridge Senior High School, with an overall feeder pattern utilization of 124%, and South Dade Senior High School, with an overall feeder pattern utilization of 125% (see attached analysis).

Pursuant to established procedures, a Management Team meeting was held November 6, 2000, to consider mitigation proposals from the applicant. At that time, the applicant proffered a monetary contribution of \$128,400 over and above educational facilities impact fees, which, if approved will be effected through a Declaration of Restrictions (Declaration). Should a different number of units ultimately be approved, the contribution will be modified proportionally. As noted above, the referenced contribution will be made in addition to impact fees, estimated at \$615,600. Since the property is being platted in two phases, the contribution is to be paid in two equal installments, prior to final plat approval of each phase. The Declaration places no special restriction on the expenditure of the contribution by the School Board.

The Declaration has been reviewed by the School Board Attorney's Office and a copy of the proposed Declaration will be placed on file in the Citizen's Information Center and the Recording Secretary's Office.

The Owners of the subject property are Mr. Robert Borek, Mr. James Davis, Ms. Bertha Borek, Mr. Joseph Borek and Ms. Nancy Borek.

RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the acceptance of a Declaration of Restrictions for Miami-Dade County Application No. 00-298, Robert Borek, Trustee, et al., for a voluntary contribution in addition to educational facilities impact fees, under the terms and conditions set forth above.
