SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS WITH THE JACKSON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL/PUBLIC HEALTH TRUST OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO RECEIVE FUNDING FOR THE DENTAL CLINIC AT LINDSEY HOPKINS TECHNICAL EDUCATION CENTER AND AT ROBERT MORGAN VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL INSTITUTE; PROJECT CYCLE: OCTOBER 1, 2000 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2001

The Jackson Memorial Hospital/Public Health Trust of Miami-Dade County is an organization established to foster a coordinated system of healthcare for Miami-Dade County and to promote healthy lifestyles. Since 1986, a total of 15 years, the Hospital/Trust has provided funds to operate the Robert Morgan Center for Dental Care and Education, Inc., located at Robert Morgan Vocational Technical Institute (RMVTI) and the Dade County Dental Research Clinic located at Lindsey Hopkins Technical Education Center (LHTEC).

Authorization is requested to enter into contractual agreements with the Jackson Memorial Hospital/Public Health Trust of Miami-Dade County for the continued funding of the two dental clinics. The LHTEC will be funded in the amount of \$130,000; RMVTI will be funded in the amount of \$60,000.

The Chairman of the Jackson Memorial Hospital/Public Health Trust of Miami-Dade County is Mr. Ira Clark.

Official notification relative to these contractual agreements was received on February 28, 2001. The budget period for this grant award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures beginning October 1, 2000.

No local funds are required.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. to enter into contractual agreements with the Jackson Memorial Hospital/Public Health Trust of Miami-Dade County to receive funding for the dental clinic at Lindsey Hopkins Technical Education Center, in the amount of \$130,000, and at Robert Morgan Vocational Technical Institute, in the amount of \$60,000; Project Cycle: October 1, 2000 through September 30, 2001;
2. extend these contractual agreements, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to complete the scope of the projects; and
3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
