SUBJECT: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD RULE: FINAL READING 6Gx13-5D-1.08, MAINTENANCE OF APPROPRIATE STUDENT BEHAVIOR

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on July 11, 2001, its intention to amend School Board Rule 6Gx13- 5D-1.08, Maintenance of Appropriate Student Behavior, at the meeting of August 22, 2001.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the Miami Daily Business Review on July 16, 2001, posted in various places for public information, and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended rule and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this rule has elapsed.

In accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this amended rule is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the rule in the official records of the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the amended rule. Changes from the current rule are indicated by striking through words to be deleted and underscoring words to be added.

Copies of the documents, Code of Student Conduct Elementary and Code of Student Conduct Secondary, which are incorporated by reference and a part of this rule will be forwarded to the School Board Members under separate cover prior to the School Board meeting of August 22, 2001, and will be available for inspection by the public in the Office of Board Recording Secretary, Room 924, and the Citizen Information Center, Room 158, 1450 N.E. Second Avenue, Miami, Florida 33132.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt amended Board Rule 6Gx13- 5D-1.08, Maintenance of Appropriate Student Behavior, and the documents, Code of Student Conduct Elementary, and the Code of Student Conduct Secondary, which are incorporated by reference and are a part of this rule, and authorize the Superintendent to file the rule with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective August 22, 2001.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on July 11, 2001, its intention to amend Board Rule 6Gx13- 5D-1.08, Maintenance of Appropriate Student Behavior, at its meeting of August 22, 2001.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this amendment is to update the Code of Student Conduct Elementary and Code of Student Conduct Secondary. Diverse statutes enacted/modified as a result of the 2000 Legislative Session revise information required to be in the Code of Student Conduct, e.g., defining "firearm" and "weapon"; authorizing a one-year expulsion for making threats and false reports. Additionally, changes have been made to incorporate current procedures, update document names and administrative office titles, and to enter new language.

SUMMARY: Diverse statutes enacted/modified during the 2000 Legislative Session remove the words "or an item which can be used as a weapon," require the Code of Student Conduct to include a notice relating to expulsion for making a threat or false report involving school or school personnel's property, school transportation, or a school sponsored activity. Such threats will result in the student being expelled for a period of not less than one year.

MAINTENANCE OF APPROPRIATE STUDENT BEHAVIOR

The schools are established for the benefit of all students. The educational purposes of the schools are accomplished best in a climate of student behavior that is socially acceptable and conducive to the learning and teaching process. Student behavior that disrupts this process or that infringes upon the rights of other individuals will not be tolerated. The Board endorses a zero tolerance policy toward school related violent crime.

The School Board reaffirms its support of the administrative staff and teachers in taking all necessary steps to enforce and implement all Board rules pertaining to the maintenance of appropriate student behavior. Important among these rules are those in the areas of conduct, corporal punishment, suspensions and expulsions, and climate for learning.

The School Board directs that:

- The Superintendent of Schools, through the Division of School Police, <u>Miami-Dade Schools Police Department</u> shall pursue the investigation and assist in the subsequent prosecution of any adults inciting students to perform violent and unlawful acts in the schools; and
- 2. Each individual teacher shall be granted full disciplinary authority over every student in his/her classroom, in accordance with Florida Statutes, Board rules, and administrative regulations.
