SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO FUND THE CREATING A NETWORK OF SISTER SCHOOLS PROGRAM; PROJECT CYCLE:

AUGUST 10, 2001 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2002

The State Department under the Freedom Support Act of 1992, has issued a Request for Proposals for short-term reciprocal exchanges of students, ages 14 to 18, to link a network of secondary schools in the United States with a network of schools in one or more of the Newly Independent States (NIS), formerly the Soviet Union.

From 1991 to 2001, Virtual Adult Registration (Miami Carol City Adult Education Center) has been awarded USIA grants, in the total amount of \$1,724,818. Under this funding initiative, schools in Florida have been linked with schools in the NIS to implement joint educational projects. The projects have been related to environmental issues, mutual understanding, the use of electronic mail to further mutual understanding, and to develop a bilingual health education booklet. An additional priority has been to expand the number of schools involved in the program.

For the 2001-2002 school year, the project will link seven schools in South Florida with seven schools in Baku, Azerbaijan. The long-term goal of this program is development of open, democratic societies in the NIS. During the school year, the students will focus on health education by promoting awareness of good health practices and by participating in community service activities. As part of the project, approximately 64 students and 8 educators, as escorts, will participate in reciprocal exchange visits to their partners' schools. Participating schools will plan visits with schools in the feeder pattern.

The paired schools have business partners who will provide in-kind contributions, i.e., tickets to cultural events, sightseeing tours, and receptions.

Grant funds in the amount of \$146,000 will be used to cover the cost of participants' travel, meals, hotel accommodations, salaries and supplies.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept a grant award from and enter into a contractual agreement with the State Department of the United States, in the amount of \$146,000, to fund the Creating a Network of Sister Schools program; Project Cycle: August 10, 2001 through June 30, 2002;
- extend this grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to complete the scope of the project; and
- 3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
