**SUBJECT: PROPOSED PROMULGATION OF NEW SCHOOL BOARD RULE: FINAL
READING 6Gx13- 4C-1.052, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
SCHOOLS: DEFINITION AND FUNCTIONS**

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on October 24, 2001, its intention to promulgate a new School Board Rule 6Gx13- 4C-1.052, Professional Development Schools: Definition and Functions, at the meeting of December 12, 2001.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on October 30, 2001, and posted in various places for public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the new rule and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this rule has elapsed.

In accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this new rule is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the rule in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the proposed new rule.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt new School Board Rule 6Gx13- 4C-1.052, Professional Development Schools: Definition and Functions, and authorize the Superintendent to file the rule with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective December 12, 2001.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on October 24, 2001, its intention to promulgate Board Rule 6Gx13- 4C-1.052, Professional Development Schools: Definition and Functions at its meeting of December 12, 2001.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To provide an operational definition of professional development schools and their functions.

SUMMARY: Professional Development Schools are shared and equal collaborations between schools, colleges and universities, school districts and professional organizations, and are established for the purpose of enhancing student achievement. These collaborations provide opportunities to improve teaching practice, while also improving pre-service teacher preparation programs, within the context of improved student learning.

Persons requesting such a hearing, or who wish to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided by Section 120.541(1), F.S., must do so in writing by November 19, 2001, to the Superintendent of Schools, Room 912, at the same address.

ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOOLS: DEFINITION AND FUNCTIONS

The Board recognizes that professional development schools are shared and equal collaborations between schools, colleges and universities, school districts and professional organizations for the purpose of enhancing student achievement. These collaborations are intended to establish environments of shared responsibility where learning opportunities for adults and children are integrated, individual and institutional renewal are augmented, and the process of continuous improvement in teaching and learning at all levels is enhanced. Professional development schools enhance student achievement by:

1. providing opportunities for the development of innovative programs and strategies;
2. providing opportunities for district educators to interact with college and university faculty and staff in order to enhance the continuing education of instructional personnel and improving the teaching profession;
3. providing a vehicle for research studies and examination of best practices in teaching and learning;
4. involving the school system, colleges and universities, school districts and professional organizations in efforts to improve pre-service teacher preparation programs and clinical teaching experiences; and
5. providing ongoing professional development consistent with the Professional Assessment and Comprehensive Evaluation System (PACES).
