## SUBJECT: ISSUES TO BE ADDRESSED IN THE 2002 SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM BOARD ITEM

### DISTRICT FUNDING FOR 2002 SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The matrix developed by the Office of Budget Management reflects operational costs and is based on the proposed 2002 summer school calendar. Funding reductions will be reflected in the recommended 2002 Summer School Models.

#### MODIFIED SUMMER PROGRAM

The regular school site program operational dates for the 2002 Summer School are pending finalization for Grades K-8. The recommended operational days for Grades 9-12 will be 27 days.

# PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOLS (K-8) AND SENIOR HIGH SCHOOLS (9-12)

An intensive academic program in Grades K-8 and a concentrated academic program in Grades 9-12 are being recommended.

### SUMMER CAMP ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY MODEL PILOT PROGRAMS

Tutorial summer camp programs are being proposed as pilots for selected sites.

## MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION COOPERATIVE SUMMER SCHOOL INITIATIVE

Miami-Dade County Parks and Recreation program services for participating agencies (e.g., City of North Miami Beach, City of Miami, and City of Hialeah) will be correlated with school sites to the extent possible as a result of the cooperative summer services initiative recently established.
