SUBJECT: REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING THE FLORIDA LEADERS.NET PROJECT; PROJECT CYCLE: DECEMBER 14, 2001 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2002

The Florida Department of Education (FDOE), in collaboration with the Miami Museum of Science, applied for a grant from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to implement the Florida Leaders.Net (FLN) project. The goal of the project is to enhance the existing leadership and technology initiatives to ensure that every superintendent and principal statewide has access to quality leadership development training.

FDOE will utilize the Florida Technology Trainer Enhancement Center (TTEC) at the Miami Museum of Science as the prime contractor for FLN. TTEC will work collaboratively with the Florida Association of District School Superintendents and the six Area Centers for Educational Enhancement (ACEE) to deliver a comprehensive leadership program for principals and superintendents throughout the state.

Miami-Dade County Public Schools, in its capacity as the fiscal agent for the ACEE Region VI, is being awarded by the FDOE an amount of \$67,415 (Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Grant: \$42,415; and Federal through State Funds: \$25,000) to pay for one part-time regional coordinator, fringe benefits, travel for the regional coordinator and mentors, contracted projects, printing and other curriculum materials, and supplies and software to be used as a resource and reference for principals.

The regional coordinator will be responsible for scheduling and promoting regional institutes, coordinating the activity of leadership mentors, and providing on-line follow-up coaching to principals and superintendents attending the institutes. Mentors will provide principals attending the FLN Professional Development Institutes with one-to-one mentoring, as well as, hands-on support at the school site level for the implementation of technology and professional development plans.

Official notification of this grant award was received on January 16, 2002, which is after the start of the budget period. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from December 14, 2001.

No local funds are required.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$67,415, for funding the Florida Leaders.Net Project; Project Cycle: December 14, 2001 through September 30, 2002;
- 2. extend this grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to fully expend the grant award and thus complete the scope of the project; and
- 3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency, such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
