SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE FLORIDA MENTOR TEACHER SCHOOL PILOT PROGRAM AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH RYDER ELEMENTARY CHARTER SCHOOL TO IMPLEMENT THE FLORIDA MENTOR TEACHER SCHOOL PILOT PROGRAM, PROJECT

CYCLE: JULY 1, 2001 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2002

The Florida Department of Education (FDOE) issued a Request for Proposals under the grant initiative, Florida Mentor Teacher School Pilot Program. Ryder Elementary Charter School submitted a grant application, and received funding in the amount of \$142,500.

In accordance with the FDOE grant guidelines for the Florida Mentor Teacher School Pilot Program, Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) must be the fiscal agent on behalf of charter schools that receive such grants. The Board's approval of the recommended action would not constitute an endorsement of the grant or its intended use. It would merely satisfy the Board's requirement under the Florida Statute 228.056 Charter Schools which requires that M-DCPS serve as the fiscal agent.

Authorization is being requested for M-DCPS to enter into a contractual agreement with Ryder Elementary Charter School to receive grant funds from the FDOE, in the amount of \$142,500, to continue the implementation of the Florida Mentor Teacher School Pilot Program. Under the contractual agreement with M-DCPS, the charter school will be responsible for implementing the project outlined in the grant application and expending the grant funds according to the proposed budget. The project goal is to establish a five-step career ladder that will give outstanding teachers recognition and higher salaries.

Official notification relative to this grant award was received on March 19, 2002, which is after the start of the budget period. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures beginning July 1, 2001.

No local funds are required.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$142,500, for funding under the Florida Mentor Teacher School Pilot Program and enter into a contractual agreement with Ryder Elementary Charter School, in the amount of \$142,500, to implement the Florida Mentor Teacher School Pilot Program, Project Cycle: July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002. This grant award is accepted in accordance with Florida Statutes 228.056, Charter Schools. This action is not an endorsement of the activities undertaken by charter schools;
- 2. extend this grant award and contractual agreement, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if it is deemed necessary in order to complete the scope of the project; and
- 3. direct Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
