Due to the consistent drop of enrollment at Lillie C. Evans Elementary School, 306 students as of 9/21/02, it is recommended that the K-8 Center previously approved for that location be changed to John I. Smith Elementary School.

Evans Elementary School to be assigned to John I. Smith Elementary School.

- 5. authorize the revision to the five-year work program and the transfer of funds previously assigned to the K-8 Center at Lillie C. Evans Elementary School to John I. Smith Elementary School pending approval by the Department of Education.
