**SUBJECT: REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM
THE EWING MARION KAUFFMAN FOUNDATION FOR FUNDING
THE MAKING A JOB PROJECT**

COMMITTEE: EDUCATION AND SCHOOL OPERATIONS

The Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation provides funds for the implementation and dissemination of entrepreneurship education instructional models in elementary and middle school classrooms. The goal is to form partnerships with outstanding school districts that have experience-based education and entrepreneurial leadership development as part of their vision for students.

Staff from the Department of School-To-Career Initiatives, Division of Student/Career Services, developed and submitted a grant application designed to provide seven middle schools with the opportunity to experience entrepreneurship first-hand. The following seven middle schools were selected because their feeder elementary schools are currently implementing the entrepreneurial model:

No matching funds are required as a condition to receive the grant funding. Grant funds in the amount of \$27,000 will be used for personnel stipends, part-time hourly, educational materials, supplies, field trips, travel, and contracted services.

Official notification of this grant award was received February 11, 2003, which is after the start of the grant period. Reimbursement of grant-related expenditures is authorized effective November 1, 2002.

1. accept a grant award from the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation for funding the Making a Job Project in the amount of \$27,000 for the grant period of November 1, 2002 through July 30, 2003;
2. extend this program as authorized through official notification from the granting agency in order to complete the goals of the program; and
3. direct Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved or as amended by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
