SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT ON SELECTION OF CONSTRUCTION Revised CONSULTANTS AND THE REAL IMPACT OF CONSTRUCTION AND PROCUREMENT REFORM

COMMITTEE: LEGISLATIVE RELATIONS, PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PERSONNEL SERVICES

On August 21, 2002, the School Board acted upon the recommendation of the Superintendent to contract with MIA Consultants for Construction Claims Consulting Services.

Recent media inquiries have brought to light reported deficiencies in the company's qualifications, selection criteria used, and administrative oversight of their work. This raises serious questions Revised about the administration's ability to recommend and supervise these contracts.

It will be beneficial to the School Board and the public to receive a detailed written report on this matter from the Superintendent at its October 22, 2003 meeting. This report should include rationale for the Superintendent's recommendation of construction consultant contracts, selection Revised criteria used, nature of the administrative oversight for this Construction Claims Consulting Services contract and reasons it took almost a year to take formal action. It would also be beneficial to understand the real impact of all construction and procurement reforms to date.
