In December 1994, Miami hosted the Summit of the Americas. This event resulted in an agreement to unite the economies of the Western Hemisphere into a single free trade agreement. The heads of state and government of the 34 democracies in the region agreed to construct a Free Trade Areas of the Americas (FTAA), in which barriers to trade and investment would be progressively eliminated.

The City of Miami will be hosting FTAA Ministerial meetings from November 16 - 21, 2003, in downtown Miami. Although this event is expected to be a catalyst for positive economic stimulation in the South Florida area, it will be one of the most demanding challenges for the entire local law enforcement community in recent history.


In order to ensure a safe and peaceful event, the Miami Police Department (MPD) has invoked Mutual Aid of its law enforcement partners throughout South Florida. This is necessary as the personnel resources needed far exceed those MPD can provide.
