Magnet and innovative choice programs/schools are unique educational programs operating within the District for which special resources are provided, including dual enrollment/credit opportunities for students at private and public colleges and universities within Miami-Dade County. The proposed dual enrollment services will take place as indicated below, in an amount not to exceed \$366,404, effective July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006.

The appropriation for this item will be included in the General Fund of the 2005-2006 Tentative Budget to be recommended for adoption in July 2005, under Fund 0100, Function 5103, magnet and innovative programs, Object 5310, various locations.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to enter into contractual agreements with Florida International University, in an amount not to exceed \$221,304; Florida Memorial University, in an amount not to exceed \$20,000; Miami Dade College, in an amount not to exceed \$50,600; St. Thomas University, in an amount not to exceed \$4,500; and University of Miami, in an amount not to exceed \$70,000; for a total amount not to exceed \$366,404, for dual enrollment services for magnet programs/schools, effective July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006.
