Background

Since 1991, the District has utilized a contracting method known as Job Order Contracting (JOC), which is used to acquire general construction services to execute minor construction and capitalized maintenance projects. Work orders are based on competitively bid unit pricing.

Renewal of Contractual Agreement

At its meeting of February 16, 2005 the School Board approved an award to Carivon Construction Company for Job Order Contracting Services, with a maximum amount of \$2,000,000. After evaluating the services rendered by Carivon Construction Company, Facilities Operations, Maintenance has determined that this contractor has performed satisfactorily and is requesting authorization to renew the contractual agreement for a final additional period of one year.

The current contract expires on February 15, 2006, and the one-year renewal period will commence on the date that the current contract meets the maximum value, or on February 16, 2005, whichever occurs first. Article 14 of the contract also prescribes a cost adjustment based on the Construction Cost Index as published by Engineering News Record. This adjustment results in an overall cost increase of 4.24% to the unit orices.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida authorize the Superintendent to renew the contractual agreement with Carivon Construction Company, Contract No. JOC 05-C10A, in conformance with Article 14 of the contract, for a period of one vear, commencing on the date the current contract meets the maximum value, or on February 16, 2006 whichever occurs first.
