AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH APPLICATION NO. 06-163, SWEET HOME BAPTIST CHURCH, INC., LOCATED AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SW 180 STREET AND SW 107 AVENUE, PROVIDING FOR A MONETARY DONATION IN ADDITION TO EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IMPACT FEES AS ALLOWED FOR UNDER THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

Background

Sweet Home Baptist Church, Inc. (applicant), is requesting a zoning change from AU (Agriculture) to RU-3M (Minimum Apartment House District), on approximately 10.48 acres located approximately at the southwest corner of SW 180 Street and SW 107 Avenue (see location map). The proposed 121 units are estimated to generate 89 additional students (see attached school impact analysis). The existing zoning classification presently allows the applicant to build 2 units, for a total of 123 units.

Pursuant to the terms of the Interlocal Agreement for School Facility Planning (Interlocal), the School Board (Board), local government, in this instance Miami-Dade County (County), and the development community are to collaborate to develop options which seek to address the impact of proposed residential development on public schools where the development would result in an increase in the schools' FISH % utilization (permanent and relocatable), beyond the threshold review level of 115%; in this case, one of the school facilities that would serve the proposed development meets the referenced threshold.

Additional Information

At its April 13, 2005 meeting, the Board approved School District criteria that allow District staff to make recommendations on residential zoning applications that impact upon public schools beyond the 115% of FISH capacity review threshold. The criteria also outline specific steps to guide District staff's consultation with developers and input at public hearings, in an attempt to provide the required number of student stations to mitigate the impact of proposed residential development. Subsequent to a determination by District staff that the proposed development is above the review threshold, the developer is requested to consider and select from several mitigation options. As a result, the District met with the above applicant to discuss possible mitigation options.

The applicant has volunteered to mitigate the full capital cost of additional twenty-seven senior high school student stations, and proffered a Declaration of Restrictions (Covenant) to provide a monetary donation covering the capital cost of twenty-seven senior high school student stations at \$25,570 (\$690,390), less educational facilities impact fees estimated at \$235,950, for a total donation of \$454,440. The entire donation is due prior to final plat approval of the application. In the event the County approves fewer units, the donation will be reduced on a pro-rata basis.

The donation is to be utilized for capital improvements to relieve the impacted school.

The Covenant will be reviewed by the School Board Attorney's Office prior to recordation.

RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to accept a Declaration of Restrictions in connection with Application No. 06-163, Sweet Home Baptist Church, Inc., located at the southwest corner of SW 180 Street and SW 107 Avenue, for the provision of a voluntary monetary donation over and above educational facilities impact fees in the amount of \$454,440.

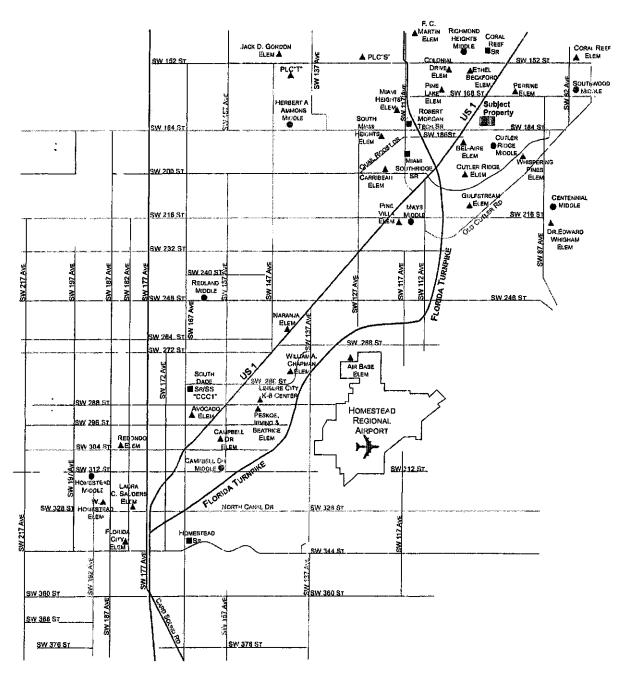
OPERATING COSTS: According to Financial Affairs, the average cost for K-12 grade students amounts to \$6,549 per student. The total annual operating cost for additional students residing in this development, if approved, would total \$582,861.

CAPITAL COSTS: Based on the State's December - 2006 student station cost factors*, capital costs for the estimated additional students to be generated by the proposed development are:

ELEMENTARY Does not meet the threshold
MIDDLE Does not meet the threshold
SENIOR 27 x \$25,570 = \$690,390
