In 1978, the Education Task Force of the Sonoma County, California Commission on the Status of Women initiated Women's History Week to celebrate the many historical and contemporary contributions of women to our nation.

In 1987, the National Women's History Project petitioned the U.S. Congress to expand the weeklong celebration to the entire month of March. Since then, each year Congress has issued a resolution designating March as Women's History Month. With each year's observance, programs, events, and activities in celebration of Women's History Month have become more extensive as information and ideas have been developed.

In 1998, the Florida Legislature amended Florida Statutes to require instruction in "women's contributions to the United States." Throughout the school year, students in Miami-Dade County Public Schools study the many contributions of women and how they have impacted history. In recognition of Women's History Month, a curriculum packet will be distributed to all schools to educate students about women's contributions to our community, state, and nation.

To honor the originality, imagination, and multiple dimensions of women's lives, ***Women's Art: Women's Vision*** has been designated as the 2008 theme.
