The Intel Science Talent Search is America's oldest and most prestigious pre-college science competition and is often called the "junior Nobel Prize". Every year, more than 1,700 American high school seniors enter Intel STS by submitting original projects from a wide range of mathematics and science disciplines. The field of 1,700 is narrowed to 300 semifinalists, and then to 40 finalists. The Intel STS provides an opportunity for high school seniors to have their original projects recognized by a national jury of highly regarded professional scientists.

This year, 12 students in the State of Florida have been named semifinalists in the Intel STS and four of the twelve students are from Miami Dade County. Proudly representing Miami Dade County Public Schools are Miami Palmetto Senior High students Alexander Li and Yunxin (Joy) Jiao and representing Dr. Michael Krop Senior High is Chen Lossos. Mollie Sussman is the fourth student, a senior at the Hebrew Academy.

Each of the 300 semifinalists receives \$1,000, and another \$1,000 is awarded to each of their schools. Intel assumed the title sponsorship of Intel STS, which was formerly named the Westinghouse Science Talent Search, in 1998 in order to increase the spotlight on the need to improve math and science education in the United States. Intel increased the annual awards and scholarships from \$207,000 to \$1.25 million. Since then, interest in the competition has risen significantly: the 1,705 entrants of 2007 were the highest in the last ten years.

WHEREAS, the Intel Science Talent Search 2008 semifinalists from Miami-Dade County Public Schools are Alexander Li and Yunxin (Joy) Jiao from Miami Palmetto Senior High School, and Chen Lossos from Dr. Michael Krop Senior High School; and

WHEREAS, each of the 300 Intel Science Talent Search 2008 semifinalists receive \$1,000 and another \$1,000 is awarded to each of their schools; and

WHEREAS, Intel assumed the title sponsorship of the competition in 1998 in order to increase the spotlight on the need to improve math and science education in the United States;
