To combat the growing epidemic of childhood obesity leading to diseases such as cardiovascular disease, high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol, and type-2 diabetes, the American Heart Association and the William J. Clinton Foundation have joined together to form the Alliance for a Healthier Generation. The Alliance's goal is to stop the nationwide increase in childhood obesity by taking bold, innovative steps to help all children live longer and healthier lives.

The Alliance further believes that healthy school environments are essential to equipping students with the knowledge and skills necessary to make healthy choices and reinforcing the importance of those healthy choices through opportunities for students to eat healthy foods and participate in physical education and physical activity.

To assist Miami-Dade County Public Schools in achieving the goal of developing healthy schools, The Michael and Susan Dell Foundation awarded a four-year \$2 million grant to the Alliance to implement the Healthy Schools Program district wide. This is the first district wide national roll out of the Healthy Schools Program in an urban setting. Locally, The Health Foundation of South Florida contributed \$400,000 and the Peacock Foundation contributed \$300,000 to ensure full implementation over the four year period.

During the 2007-2008 school year, seven schools from Miami-Dade County, who worked diligently throughout the year to meet the challenge of transforming their schools into healthy environments according to national standards, were among the 43 schools recognized by former President William J. Clinton at the William J. Clinton Presidential Library in Little Rock, Arkansas. The nationally recognized schools and their level of achievement are North Beach Elementary, Bronze; Silver Bluff Elementary, Bronze; G.W. Carver Elementary, Bronze; Flagami Elementary, Bronze; Miami Edison Middle, Bronze; Miami Springs Middle, Silver; and Felix Varela Senior High, Bronze.

The principals, teachers, and students are to be commended for their dedication and outstanding commitment to developing a healthy school environment.
