STRATEGIC PLAN: RETURN OF INVESTMENT OF GRANT DOLLARS

During the past several years, the need for supplemental educational funding has been key to the continuation of critical services and programs. Due to the financial crisis facing the nation and the state, that need has grown. Last month, Congress passed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) appropriating billions in competitive grant funds; there are more than \$5 billion of competitive grant funding available. The district must aggressively pursue these supplemental funding opportunities. In addition, the use of the funds as associated with the ARRA is going to be tied to an increased level of accountability.

Currently, the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs and Grants Administration (OIAGA) handles 195 different grant programs with a total value of over \$410 million in supplemental funding. The credit for the creation of the Grants Development unit in our district is due to the late Dr. Robert B. Ingram who several years ago brought an item to establish a grants unit to seek supplemental funding for the district. The office lost three positions as a result of the "Transformation" in November 2008 due to the necessary In light of the funding now available through the ARRA, the budget reductions. increased levels of accountability associated with those grant funds, and the need to aggressively seek other supplemental funding sources, it is prudent to restore the staffing levels to OIAGA. The cost to the district for the 3 positions for salaries and fringe benefits totals \$242,111.
