National Teacher Day recognizes educators across the nation for their outstanding work in the classroom. National Teacher Day has its origins in Kansas. It was around 1944, when educator Mattye Whyte Woodridge began corresponding with education leaders and politicians about the need for a national day celebrating teachers. Woodridge wrote to first lady Eleanor Roosevelt, who convinced Congress to proclaim a National Teacher Day in 1953.

The National Education Association (NEA) and its affiliates lobbied Congress to create a national day honoring educators. As a result of their efforts, Congress eventually declared March 7, 1980 as National Teacher Day for that year only.

The first Tuesday in March continued to be observed as National Teacher Day by the NEA and its affiliates until 1985. That year, the National PTA named the first full week in May Teacher Appreciation Week. The NEA voted to make the Tuesday of that week National Teacher Day. This year, National Teacher Day will be celebrated on May 5 under the theme "Great Teachers Make Great Public Schools."
