REQUEST AUTHORIZATION FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS WITH FOUR COMMUNITY AGENCIES TO PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING SERVICES TO STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,388,864, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2009, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010, CONTINGENT UPON APPROVAL OF THE 2009-2010 DISTRICT BUDGET

Authorization is requested for the Superintendent of Schools to enter into a contractual agreement with four community agencies that have specific expertise in providing educational and vocational training services to a unique population of Students with Disabilities (SWD) which includes: autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disabilities, and severe behavior disorders.

This unique population of students with disabilities will receive educational and vocational training in an age-appropriate environment to include, but not limited to, classroom instruction, on-the-job-training, job coaching services, job placement assistance, community-based instruction, and post-school living skills. Students are provided with a variety of employability skills and training including packaging, sorting, collating, assembly skills, basic clerical skills, and culinary skills in a workshop environment.

Funding for services provided by each community agency is delineated below:

- Easter Seals South Florida, Inc., (Easter Seals Culinary Arts) will serve a maximum of 30 students, between the ages of 16-22, in an amount not to exceed \$409,748;
- Exceptional Development Corporation of South Florida (EDC) will serve a maximum of 30 students between the ages of 18-22, in an amount not to exceed \$390,694;

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- Goodwill Industries of South Florida, Inc., (Goodwill) will serve 35 students between the ages of 18-22, in an amount not to exceed \$453,427; and
- Sunrise Community, Inc., (Sunrise Doral) will serve 10 students between the ages of 18-22, in amount not to exceed \$134,995.

Facility reviews, site visits, monitoring student records and program delivery models, by District staff found the programs to be effective and in compliance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requirements.

The Professional Services Contract Committee established by School Board Rule 6Gx13-3F-1.021, Professional Services Contracts, reviewed these contracts on April 30, 2009, and recommended that an exception to the School Board Rule regarding bids or Request for Proposals (RFP) be granted as these agencies have specific expertise in providing educational and vocational training services.

Funding for these services will be generated by 80% of the Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) generated from the Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) based on the level of services needed for each student listed in their Individual Educational Plan (IEP). The remaining 20% of the FTE will cover ancillary costs.

The appropriation for this item will be included in the General Fund of the 2009-2010 Tentative under Fund 0100, Function 5217, Program 6840, Object 5310, Location 9731 to be recommended for adoption in July 2009, contingent upon the approval of the 2009-2010 District Budget.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent of Schools to:

- 1. enter into contractual agreements with four community agencies to provide educational and vocational training services to Students with Disabilities, in an amount not to exceed \$1,388,864, effective July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010, contingent upon approval of the 2009-2010 District Budget with:
 - Easter Seals South Florida, Inc., (Easter Seals Culinary Arts), in an amount not to exceed \$409,748;
 - Exceptional Development Corporation of South Florida (EDC), in an amount not to exceed \$390,694;
 - Goodwill Industries of South Florida, Inc., (Goodwill), in an amount not to exceed \$453,427;
 - Sunrise Community, Inc., (Sunrise Doral), for an amount not to exceed \$134,995; and,

2. grant an exception to Board Rule 6Gx13-<u>3F-1.021</u>, as these agencies have specific expertise in this field.

The appropriation for this item will be included in the General Fund of the 2009-2010 Tentative Budget to be recommended for adoption in July 2009, contingent upon approval of the 2009-2010 District Budget.
