STRATEGIC PLAN: GENERAL OPERATIONS

Pursuant to Rule 6A-1.0503(4), FAC, Definition of Qualified Instructional Personnel, the School Board must approve those teachers assigned to teach out-of-field. To ensure that the District receives the highest levels of Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) funding possible, instructional personnel requiring School Board approval to teach out-of-field is submitted to the Board as a Board Agenda Item. Attached is the list of impacted instructional personnel covering the period of October 27, 2009 through November 30, 2009.

The District, with support from region offices, schools and Information Technology Services, closely monitors out-of-field assignments, as well as teachers on such assignments, to insure compliance with appropriate certification requirements and timelines. Said requirements and timelines are as follows:

- Individuals assigned to teach out-of field must complete at least 6 semester hours of
  college credit or 120 inservice points toward in-field compliance each year. For
  Bachelor's degree level subjects, achievement of a passing score on the appropriate
  subject area examination earned since July 1, 2002, meets all requirements toward infield compliance. All requirements toward in-field certification must be completed within
  three years.
- Out-of-field teachers assigned to teach English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
  must complete at least three semester hours of college credit or the equivalent toward
  the ESOL requirements within the first two calendar years from the date of the initial
  assignment. Additionally, three semester hours or the equivalent must be completed
  during each year thereafter until all requirements are completed.

There is no cost to the District for this item.
