Authorization is requested to enter int o a contract with the Miami-Dade Economic Advocacy Trust (Trust) to receive funds, in the approximate amount of \$200,000, to support the Teen Court Program for the grant period of March 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011. The Trust was created by the Miami-Dade Board of County Commission (Board) pursuant to Ordinance No. 92-12. The Board has designated the Trust as the entity to operate the Teen Court Program on behalf of Miami-Dade County. The Teen Court Program, an alternative sanctioning program for first-time youthful offenders who agree to allow their peers to determine sentencing instead of the juvenile justice system, will also provide tutorial programs for targeted students in 5 selected senior high schools. The following senior high schools were identified by the Trust to participate in the program: Miami Carol City; Miami Norland; Booker T. Washington; Miami Northwestern; and South Dade. This grant will be managed by District/School Operations, Special Projects, and supports the Youth Violence Prevention Summit and the Education Compact with Miami-Dade County.

The Teen Court Program will allow students a second chance when faced with the possibility of discipline for violating school rules and regulations and will help decrease juvenile delinquency through early intervention. The Teen Court Program incorporates a peer sanctioning process whereby youth may participate as a defense and/or prosecuting attorney, juror, clerk, and/or bailiff in the sentencing decisions. These peer youth will receive community service credit, as well as beneficial hands-on experience regarding careers associated with the judicial system.

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No matching funds are required as a condition to receive this grant funding. The grant will fund part-time program coordinators at each school, part-time teachers for tutoring, and overtime for custodial/security services for extended day activities.

Official notification of this grant award is anticipated by March 13, 2010 which is after the start of the grant period. Reimbursement of grant-related expenditures is authorized effective March 1, 2010. Indirect costs are not allowed.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. enter into a contract with the Miami-Dade Economic Advocacy Trust to receive funds in the amount of \$200,000, to support the Teen Court Program for the grant period of March 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011;
- extend this contract and program as authorized through official notification from the granting agency in order to complete the goals of the program; and
- 3. direct Financial Services to establish appropriations in the amounts approved or as amended by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
