**SUBJECT: CLOSE-OUT REPORT ON THE U.S. CENSUS**

**COMMITTEE: INNOVATION, EFFICIENCY AND GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS**

**LINK TO STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK: STUDENT, PARENT, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

Recognizing the importance of the 2010 Census, the School District began a very aggressive outreach campaign on November 17, 2009, in partnership with the Miami-Dade County Complete Count Committee, to encourage all residents to participate and be counted in the Census. These efforts were truly successful, with participation rates surpassing levels from the 2000 Census.

On March 17, 2011, the U.S. Census published data establishing Florida's 2010 population at 18,801,310, representing a 17.6% increase from 2000 levels. Miami-Dade County grew 10.8%, with a population of 2,496,435. County-wide, the white non-Hispanic population decreased by 17.7% to 383,551, the Hispanic population increased by 25.7%, to 1,623,859 and the Black or African American population saw a slight decline of 0.4% to 425,650. In Miami-Dade County, the number of children under the age of 18 decreased by 2.4%.

Among the five most populous incorporated places in the state, the City of Miami is listed with a population of 399,457, an increase of 10.2% in the last decade (this number may be challenged, as it appears the population may be higher than reported). The City of Hialeah's population fell by 0.8% to 224,669. Attached are population results for the State of Florida and a Chart listing population numbers by Municipality for Miami-Dade County, comparing population rates between 2000 and 2010.

Also of interest is the number of vacant housing units reported, which increased 12.3% (122,083 vacancies) during the decade. Although some of these units may be second homes, this number is a clear indication of the severe economic conditions experienced in Miami-Dade County.

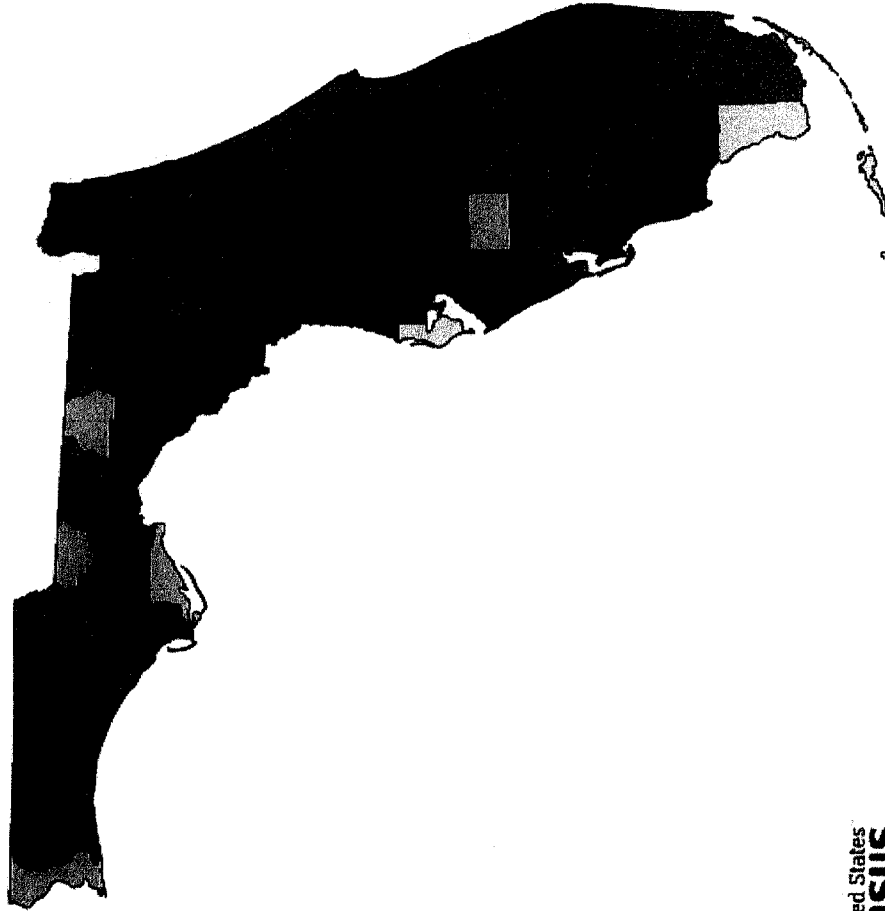

As a result, our communities will benefit from over \$400 billion in federal funds that will be distributed annually to state and local areas, for schools, child care centers, hospitals, senior centers, emergency services, roads and job training centers.

## POPULATION CHANGE BY COUNTY: 2000-2010

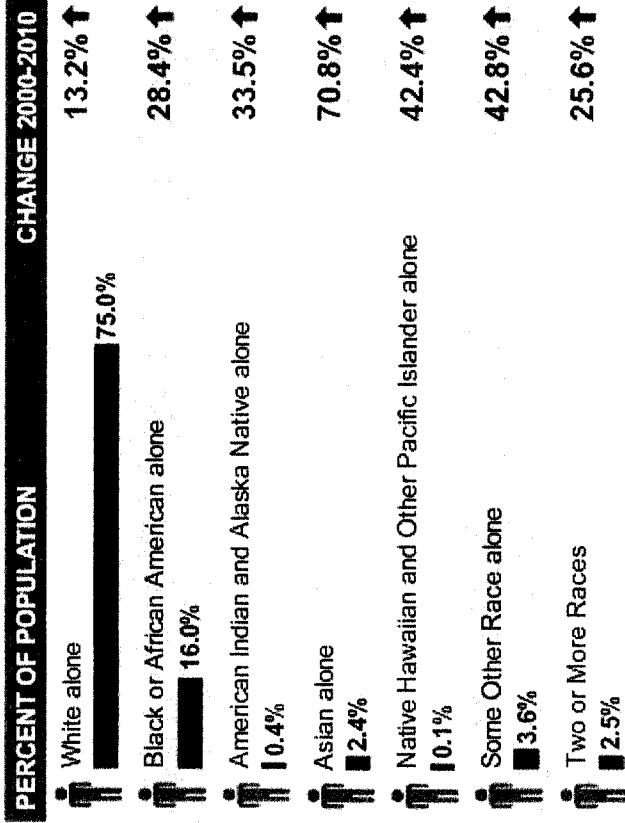

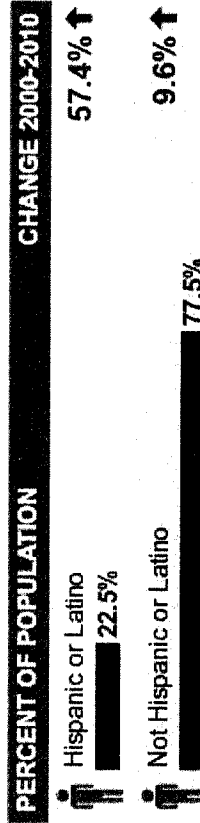


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## STATE POPULATION BY RACE FLORIDA: 2010
