**SUBJECT: REQUEST THE SUPERINTENDENT TO MODIFY THE
SCHOOL BOARD RULE PERTAINING TO THE ADVISORY
COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP AND APPOINTMENT**

In these difficult times, wherein our board and our community are grappling with difficult decisions, the members of our community that serve on our Advisory Boards are one of our most valuable resources. As such, we should insure that our Advisory Boards are diverse and provide us with differing perspectives on the issues that come before them. Furthermore, in our ongoing pursuit to establish good governance and accountability, the Miami-Dade County Public School Board sees the necessity to modify current practices concerning our Advisory Committee membership so that the same are in accordance with the practices of Miami-Dade County and other municipalities.

We begin by taking this opportunity to recognizing the commitment and exemplary voluntary work performed by the outstanding members of our community who volunteer to serve on our Advisory Boards. However, the time has come to modify our Board rule on Committee Membership to address three important criteria: residency, conflicts of interest and the promotion of diversity in membership.

Residency; Members of MDCS Advisory Committees shall be permanent residents and electors of Miami-Dade County. Committee Members should have reputations for integrity and community service. In addition, all members should have demonstrated an interest in the field covered by the committee. This requirement can be waived under extraordinary circumstances per term by a two-thirds vote of the Miami-Dade County School Board. Similarly, unless the School Board by two-thirds (2/3) vote of its membership waives the residency requirement for a particular member, a member of any Advisory Committee who ceases to be a resident of Miami-Dade County during the term of his or her office shall immediately advise the Clerk of the School Board. Upon being advised by the Clerk of such circumstances, the School Board shall declare the position to be vacant and shall promptly fill the same pursuant to School Board Bylaws and Policies.

Conflict of Interest; No person shall be eligible to serve on any Advisory Committee if, at the time of appointment to the Committee, the person has filed a lawsuit against the School Board that is pending at the time of appointment and/or a challenge to a policy set by the Miami-Dade County Public School Board without relinquishing his or her seat on the Committee unless the School Board by two-thirds (2/3) vote of its membership waives this requirement. Similarly, Advisory Committee members shall not be appointed to a committee wherein their livelihood depends on the area regulated, and/or administered by the committee. Finally, no member of the Advisory Committee shall become a candidate for elective political office during his or her term. Should a member of the Committee qualify as a candidate for elective political office, such qualification shall be deemed a tender of resignation from the Committee. A person is prohibited from serving on the Advisory Committee where such service would violate federal or state law, and/or the School Board Bylaws and Policies.

Diversity; The purpose of the Advisory Committee is to provide a broad array of perspectives as to the challenges that affect our district. Therefore, in accordance with County and Municipal Ordinances, no person shall serve simultaneously on more than two Advisory Committees of the Miami-Dade County Public School Board, unless the School Board has by a two-thirds (2/3) vote approved the appointment after being advised of all other committees upon which the person sits. This waiver, if granted, shall be afforded per term and must be renewed when the committee member's term expires and he/she is reappointed.
