Students from Museum Magnet programs at William Jennings Bryan Elementary School and North Miami Middle School produced two books about Haitian culture last month, in collaboration with the Haitian Heritage Museum and a book-making consultant.

The first-grade students from William Jennings Bryan Elementary produced, "Through the Eyes of My Haitian Friend: What Pictures Can Tell Us About Culture," which consists of hand-painted drawings that tell the story of a young Haitian American child who takes a non-Haitian friend on a tour of the various rooms of their home. North Miami Middle School's eighth-grade students produced the book, "Sak Pase: A Teenage Guide to Culture," consisting of pictures, students' illustrations and narratives that compare and contrast the culture of Liberia Africa with Haiti's in relation to food, language, dress, celebration and festivals.

Last Thursday marked the second anniversary of the devastating 7.0-magnitude earthquake that struck Haiti on January 12, 2010 near the capital of Port-au-Prince and surrounding cities. The earthquake affected at least three million people, nearly one-third of Haiti's entire population. According to estimates, it may take upwards of 10 years for stricken areas of Haiti to be rebuilt.

On behalf of the Miami-Dade County School Board, I would like to extend our best wishes and continued support to the people of Haiti, as well as commend the students of William Jennings Bryan Elementary and North Miami Middle schools for promoting Haitian culture through their respective books.
