In 2005, she resigned to open her first restaurant, "Michy's." with husband and business partner, David Martinez. Three years later, they opened "Sra. Martinez" a chic, down-to-earth tapas restaurant in Miami's Design District. Following that, they opened two eateries, "Michelle Bernstein" and "MB Terrace," a year later in Palm Beach, Florida.

Most recently, Chef Bernstein launched the Miami chapter of *Common Threads*, an after-school program that utilizes culinary arts to teach underprivileged students age 8-11, social skills, and healthy eating habits. The program that was started in Chicago, Illinois by Chef Art Smith now has six participating schools in Miami-Dade County. Currently, she is working with Miami-Dade County Public Schools on a chef partnership dedicated to improving the quality of cafeteria food in schools throughout the county with the help of several South Florida chefs.

Additionally, Chef Bernstein has partnered with First Lady Michelle Obama's *Let's Move Salad Bars to Schools!*, a major White House initiative targeting childhood obesity and the availability of fresh fruits and vegetables in school meals via school gardens.

Chef Michelle Bernstein is to be commended for her passion, creativity and commitment to education and to the students of Miami-Dade County.
