For the past four years, the School District has collaborated with its transportation partners to promote pedestrian and vehicle driver safety by sponsoring the Senior High School Student Safety Campaign, consisting of a Public Service Announcement (PSA) and poster contest, focusing on the dangers of distracted driving.

This year, the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority (MDX) joined the partnership and lent its resources to help capture a larger audience of students. In this regard, MDX donated \$1,000 to provide monetary awards for three winners in each category. MDX also will donate \$5,000 to the schools where the winning students attend (\$2,500 poster and \$2,500/PSA). In addition, MDX secured television spots with WSVN—Channel 7 to broadcast the winning entries. The winning PSA's and posters will be distributed to all District senior high school campuses during the annual National Teen Driver Safety Week, designated by the U.S. Congress as the third week in October.

Contest Winners

Hundreds of entries were received from schools located throughout the District. The Public Schools Community Traffic Safety Team served as the judging panel, and selected six winners; three winners per production category. The submittals were scored for creativity, effectiveness and motivational appeal to inspire senior high school-aged students.

The following students were selected as the top three, per production category:

Poster Contest:

- Jonnie Piñon from Miami Senior High—First Place Winner (\$250 award);
- Vinh Vo from Alonzo and Tracy Mourning Senior High Biscayne Bay Campus—Second Place Winner (\$150 award); and
- Tacia Diaz from Doral Academy Charter Senior High—Third Place Winner (\$100 award)

PSA Contest:

- Manuel Lopez from Miami Senior High—First Place Winner (\$250 award);
- Antony Alvarez from Coral Reef Senior High—Second Place Winner (\$150 award); and
- Stephan Reese from Robert Morgan Educational Center—Third Place Winner (\$100 award).
