### LINK TO STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK: FINANCIAL EFFICIENCY/STABILITY

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on June 13, 2012, its intention to amend Board Policy 7540.03, Student Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety. The proposed policy changes will clarify and update District standards to include social media use by students and to add standards for the coming Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) wireless District initiative.

In addition, the Board announced its intention to amend Board Policy 7540.04, Staff Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety. The proposed policy changes will clarify and update District standards to include social media use by staff and to add standards for the coming BYOD wireless District initiative.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on June 18, 2012, posted in various places for public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended policies and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the amendment of these policies has elapsed.

In accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, these policies are presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the policies in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the proposed amended Board Policies. Changes from the current policies are indicated by <u>underscoring</u> words to be added and <u>striking through</u> words to be deleted.

### RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida adopt amended Board Policy 7540.03, Student Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety and Board Policy 7540.04, Staff Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety, and authorize the Superintendent to file the policies with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective July 18, 2012.

### NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on June 13, 2012, its intention to amend Board Policy, 7540.03, Student Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety, at its meeting on July 18, 2012.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed Board Policy is to provide the district with a policy containing the standards and guidelines for the responsible use of district network computer systems and the Internet by staff and consequences for failure to abide by these standards.

SUMMARY: The proposed policy changes add language addressing the use of Social Media by staff and the use of personal electronic devices in the coming Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Wireless Incentive.

## STUDENT NETWORK AND INTERNET ACCEPTABLE USE AND SAFETY

This policy establishes responsible and acceptable use of the network as a tool for 2 learning in the District. The District aNetwork is defined as all computer resources, 3 including software, hardware, lines and services that allow connection of District 4 computers to other computers, whether they are within the District or external to the 5 District. This includes connection to the Internet while on school property. In this 6 policy, Users are defined as students. No user may use the nNetwork to take any 7 action or receive and/or communicate any language that the employee or student 8 could not take or communicate in person. Users are defined as anyone authorized 9 by administration to use the Network. This includes, but is not limited to, staff, 10 students, parents, vendors, contractors, and volunteers. Prohibitions in applicable 11 Federal. State, and/or local law or regulation, collective bargaining agreements and 12 Board policies are included. Additionally, this policy reflects that there is no 13 expectation of privacy in the use of e-mail or network communications when such 14 communications occur over District provided equipment. by District employees, 15 students, or others. (See Board policies concerning privacy and e-mail). 16

#### Access to the Network

The District Networks gives schools the ability to share educational and research resources from around the world with all students. These resources include access to instructional applications, interactive collaboration between teachers, students and other users, document sharing, communications of all forms with people from

Obscene material is material which:

- 1. the average person, applying contemporary community standards, would find, taken as a whole, appeals solely to the prurient interest; and
- 2. depicts or describes, in a patently offensive way, sexual conduct as defined in State law (F.S. 847.001 (11)); and
- 3. taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value.
- B. Procedures for protesting instructional materials and educational media as they are accessed through the Internet are governed by Policy 2510.
- C. Use of the Internet for political activities is prohibited.
- D. Use of the <u>nN</u>etwork for product advertisement, commercial activities, political campaigning or solicitation is prohibited.

E. The District shall use an Internet Content Filter to prevent <u>#U</u>ser access to prohibited material.

Users of the District  $\pm N$ etwork are charged with notice that besides obscene material, there are other potentially objectionable materials available on the Internet, including sites with adult content, nudity, and gambling, as well as sites advocating violence and illegal activities. No content filter will ever be 100% accurate, and on occasion either objectionable material may get through or non-objectionable material may be blocked. It is a User's obligation to immediately report these lapses.

Bypassing the District content filter without authorization is strictly prohibited. The District has procedures in place to evaluate requests from  $\underline{\mathbf{u}}$  sers to block or unblock sites as necessary.

Students, parents and staff should be aware that connection to any Internet or network provider not under District control may be unfiltered, especially open wireless connections. The District is not responsible for unfiltered content that may be viewed or downloaded on District equipment that has been provided to individuals for use outside District property. The District is also not responsible for issues caused by the connection of personal devices to the District's #Network or improper use of the District's #Network or equipment.

### Privilege

- Accessing the Internet through using District equipment and/or through the District's Network is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use, including violation of this rule may result in cancellation of the privilege.
  - A. School, regional center, and District administrators are authorized to determine appropriate and acceptable use pursuant to this policy.
  - B. Any user account may be closed, suspended or revoked at any time a school, regional center, or District administrator determines an account user or holder has used the <u>nNetwork</u> in an inappropriate or unacceptable manner in violation of this or any other applicable Board policy.

- C. Inappropriate or unacceptable use is defined as use that violates this policy or the District's purpose in providing students and employees safe access to the Internet and use that violates the District Codes of Student Conduct (Elementary, Secondary, and Adult), Code of Conduct for Adult Students, Florida's Code of Ethics of the Education Profession, the District Network Security Standards, and Board policies governing employee behavior, or any local, State, or Federal law or regulation.
  - D. Access to the Internet from the District network as a tool for learning will be automatic. Parents must notify the school in writing if they do not want their child to access the Internet.

  - D. Activities which violate the Codes of Student Conduct (Policy 5500), the Code of Ethics of the Education Profession in the State of Florida, the District Network Security Standards and Board policies governing employee behavior, are prohibited.
  - E. Do not reveal your personal address and/or telephone number or that of other <u>uU</u>sers unless compelled to by law.
  - F. Electronic mail (e-mail) is not guaranteed to be private. People who operate the system do have access to all mail. Messages relating to or in support of illegal activities will be reported to the authorities without notice.

G.	Do not use the $\pm \underline{N}$ etwork in such a way that other $\pm \underline{U}$ sers would be
	unable to get the full benefit of information available. This includes,
	but is not limited to: running applications that deny the $nNetwork$ 's
	services to others, tying up computers without a legitimate
	educational or school district or school business purpose while
	others are waiting, damaging software or hardware so that others are
	unable to use it, or any conduct that would be prohibited by State
	law (F.S. 815.06).

H. Do not use the <u>nN</u>etwork to send or receive messages that discriminate based on sex, race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, political beliefs, marital status, age, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, social and family background, linguistic preference, disability or that are inflammatory.

  - B. Users must not use another individual's account without written permission from that individual. Attempts to log into the system as any other user will result in disciplinary action as described in Disciplinary Action.
  - C. Any <u>uU</u>ser that has been determined by administrators to have violated this rule may be denied future access to the Internet through the District <u>nNetwork</u>.

1 D. A uUser with a history of using other computer systems in an 2 inappropriate or unacceptable manner may be denied access to the 3 District Network. Users of the nNetwork will be held responsible for all activity 4 E. associated with the uUser's account. #### **Procedures for Use**

0

Student users must always get permission from their teachers or facilitators before using the <u>nNetwork</u> or accessing any specific file or application. Student users must also follow written and oral classroom instructions.

A. All users have the same right to use the computer resources. Users shall not play games without educational value or use the computer resources for non-academic activities when other users require the system for academic purposes

Personal use of the District  $\underline{nN}$ etwork, including e-mail and the Internet, is permitted as long as it does not interfere with an employee's duties and/or system operation and abides by all District policies and standards.

- B. Teachers are responsible for teaching proper techniques and standards for participation, for guiding student access to appropriate sections of the Internet, and for assuring that students understand that if they misuse the Network they will lose their privilege to access the Internet from the classroom environment. Students should not be provided with network access unless they are properly supervised by an individual trained to provide the guidance students require.
- C. Pursuant to Federal law, students shall receive education about the following:
  - 1. safety and security while using e-mail, chat rooms, social media, and other forms of electronic communications;
  - 2. the dangers inherent with the online disclosure of personally identifiable information; and
  - 3. the consequences of unauthorized access (e.g., "hacking"), cyberbullying, and other unlawful or inappropriate activities by students online.
- D. In a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school environment, students will be notified of additional responsibilities within the framework of the District's educational objectives. A "device" is defined as "a laptop computer, a smartphone or cellular phone, or any other electronic device that may access the school's network". Staff and students must accept and comply with the following District requirements and restrictions for participation:

## STAFF NETWORK AND INTERNET ACCEPTABLE USE AND SAFETY

2 This policy establishes the <u>responsible and</u> acceptable use of the network as a tool 3 for learning in the District. The District aNetwork is defined as all computer resources, including software, hardware, lines and services that allow connection of 4 5 District computers to other computers, whether they are within the District or 6 external to the District. This includes connection to the Internet while on school 7 property. Users are defined as anyone authorized by administration to use the 8 aNetwork. This includes, but is not limited to, staff, students, parents, vendors, contractors, and volunteers. No uUser may use the nNetwork to take any action or 9 receive and/or communicate any language that the employee or student could not 10 take or communicate in person. Users are defined as anyone authorized by administration to use the Network. This includes, but is not limited to, staff, 11 12 students, parents, vendors, contractors, and volunteers. Prohibitions in applicable 13 14 Federal, State, and/or local law or regulation, collective bargaining agreements and Board policies are included. Additionally, there is no expectation of privacy in the 15 use of e-mail or network communications when such communications occur over 16 17 District provided equipment by District employees, students, or others. (See Board 18 policies concerning privacy and e-mail).

Inappropriate or unacceptable use is defined as use that violates this policy or the District's purpose in providing students and employees safe access to the Internet and use that violates the District's Codes of Student Conduct (Elementary, Secondary, and Adult), Florida's Code of Ethics of the Education Profession, the District's #Network Security Standards, all Board policies governing employee behavior or any local, State, or Federal law or regulation.
  - D. Access to the Internet from the District <u>nN</u>etwork as a tool for learning will be automatic. Parents must notify the school in writing if they do not want their child to access the Internet.

### **Network Etiquette**

Activities which violate the Code of Student Conduct (both elementary and secondary), Code of Conduct for Adult Students, the Code of Ethics of the Education Profession in the State of Florida, the District's nNetwork Security Standards and policies governing employee behavior are prohibited.
  - E. Do not reveal your personal address and/or telephone number or that of other uUsers unless compelled to by law.

F. Electronic mail (e-mail) is not guaranteed to be private. People who 1 2 operate the system do have access to all mail. Messages relating to or in support of illegal activities will be reported to the authorities 3 4 without notice. 5 6 G. Do not use the nNetwork in such a way that other uUsers would be 7 unable to get the full benefit of information available. This includes, 8 but is not limited to: running applications that deny the nNetwork's services to others, tying up computers without a legitimate 9 educational or School District or school business purpose while 10

  - B. Users must not use another individual's account without written permission from that individual. Attempts to log into the system as any other <u>uUser</u> will result in disciplinary action as described in Disciplinary Action.

### **Procedures for Use**

 $\frac{41}{42}$ 

A. All <u>uU</u>sers have the same right to use the computer resources. Users shall not play games without educational value or use the computer resources for non-academic activities when other <u>uU</u>sers require the system for academic purposes.

Personal use of the District's <u>nNetwork</u>, including e-mail and the Internet, is permitted as long as it does not interfere with an employee's duties, a student's learning activities and/or system operation and abides by all district policies and standards, State and Federal statutes, and codes of conduct. This use is a privilege, not a right, and any unacceptable use may be subject to appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal from employment.

- B. Teachers are responsible for teaching proper techniques and standards for participation, for guiding student access to appropriate sections of the Internet, and for assuring that students understand that if they misuse the nNetwork they will lose their privilege to access the Internet from the classroom environment. Students should not be provided with network access unless they are properly supervised by an individual trained to provide the guidance students require.
- C. Blogging is the activity of writing entries in, adding material to, or maintaining a "weblog." Employees shall not engage in blogging activities during working hours or use District-owned equipment unless they are specifically required to perform the employees' responsibilities and duties. District uUsers are reminded that during non-working hours they are representatives of the District and should behave in a manner that does not disrespect or discredit the education profession. Unless engaging an officially sanctioned District activity, employees using "blogs" should clearly specify that any opinions or statements are the employee's and do not reflect the views of the District. Employees are prohibited from using officially sanctioned School District logos, school mascots, and other official symbols.
- D. In a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school environment, staff must notify students of the additional responsibilities within the framework of the District's educational objectives. A "device" is defined as "a laptop computer, a smartphone or cellular phone, or any other electronic device that may access the school's Network". Staff and students must accept and comply with the following District requirements and restrictions for participation:

- 1. Users may only connect personally owned devices to the District's filtered Network wirelessly or through a direct connection for data access during instructional time. Connecting to broadband services is prohibited unless there is a specific instructional purpose for doing so. Teachers should instruct students to only connect their devices to the District's filtered wireless Network for data access during school hours.
- 2. <u>Users are responsible for ensuring their devices use security applications to protect the devices from infection and prevent spreading infections from the devices.</u>
- 3. <u>Users connecting to a school's and/or District's Network shall</u> release the District from any and all liability for any damage to devices that may or is alleged to have resulted from use of the school's and/or District's network. The District shall not be responsible for a personally owned device becoming infected when connected to the District's Network.
- 4. Pursuant to School Board Policy 5517.01, cyber bullying is prohibited at all times, on campus or off, whether using District-owned equipment and networks or personally owned equipment and broadband connections.
- An employee's personal or private use of social media, such as 5. Facebook, Twitter, MySpace, blogs, etc, may have unintended consequences. Employee's may not post material of any nature that violates School Board policies involving employee conduct, state or federal law, or that disrupts the school environment. In addition, as in all other forms of contact between staff and students, inappropriate personal communications using social media is prohibited. inappropriate contact is found to have occurred, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. This prohibited conduct applies to staff members' online conduct that occurs off school property including from the employee's private computer. Postings to social media should be done in a manner that reflects credit upon the employee and the school system, is sensitive to the staff member's professional responsibilities and does not violate the Principles of Professional Conduct for the Education Profession in Florida and the Code of Ethics of the Education Profession in Florida.

Social media sites allow Users to become a "friend" or otherwise associate their "profiles" in a more private and personal arrangement which may mask inappropriate
