The country of Jamaica has a rich cultural history. Jamaica's first inhabitants were the Tainos, an Arawak-speaking people from South America, who called the island "Xaymaca," which means "land of wood and water." The Tainos settled in Jamaica prior to Christopher Columbus' arrival in 1494, who described Jamaica as "the fairest isle mine eyes ever beheld." Columbus' arrival signaled the beginning of nearly 500 years of European occupation and governance.

Spain's occupation of Jamaica began in 1510. The Spanish brought the first African slaves to the island in 1517. The British captured Jamaica in 1655 and gained formal possession of the island in 1670. The slave trade was abolished in the British colonies in 1807, but slavery was not abolished on the island until August 1, 1834. Full emancipation of slaves was declared on August 1, 1838 which is celebrated today as "Emancipation Day." From 1866 through 1884, Jamaica reverted to full crown colony system of government. In 1884, the status was adjusted to a partly representative crown colony government, which lasted to 1944. Jamaica gained independence on August 6, 1962 after more than 300 years of British colonial rule. This year, Jamaica will observe its 50th anniversary of independence with Golden Jubilee celebrations worldwide.

Jamaica's Diaspora is established in every continent in the world. There are approximately 500,000 Jamaican nationals living in Florida, with large populations in South Florida, Central Florida, and the Tampa Bay area. There are more than 80 Jamaican community organizations in Florida in the areas of education, social services, healthcare, sports and recreation, arts and culture, academia, and business.
