Administrative Professionals Week and Administrative Professionals Day were established in 1952 as "National Secretaries Week" in an effort to recognize secretaries for their contributions in the workplace and to attract people to secretarial/administrative careers. The International Association of Administrative Professionals announced the name change in 2000 to keep pace with changing job titles and expanding responsibilities of today's administrative workforce.

This year marks the 62<sup>st</sup> anniversary of Administrative Professionals Day. Over the decades, the job of an administrative professional has changed dramatically thanks to new tools, techniques and seismic shifts in the economy and culture itself. It has become one of the largest workplace observances. The event is celebrated worldwide, bringing together millions of people for community events, educational seminars, and individual corporate activities to recognize support staff.

Today, there are more than 4.1 million secretaries and administrative assistants working in the United States, according to U.S. Department of Labor statistics, and 8.9 million people working in various administrative support roles.
