For the past five years, the School District has collaborated with its transportation partners to promote pedestrian and vehicle driver safety by sponsoring the Senior High School Safety Campaign, consisting of a Public Service Announcement (PSA) and poster contest. The Campaign focuses on the dangers of distracted driving, with a heightened emphasis on the dangers of texting while driving. The winning PSA's and posters will be distributed to all District senior high school campuses during the annual National Teen Driver Safety Week, designated by the U.S. Congress as the third week in October.

Contest Winners

Numerous entries were received from schools located throughout the District. The Public Schools Community Traffic Safety Team served as the judging panel, and selected six winners; three winners per production category, plus an Honorable Mention in the PSA category. The submittals were scored for creativity, effectiveness and motivational appeal to inspire senior high school-aged students.

In an effort to maximize student participation, District staff secured a donation from Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, in the amount of \$1,050, to provide monetary awards for winners in each category.

The following students were selected as the winners, per production category:

Poster Contest:

- Naomi Cruz, from Miami Springs Senior High School First Place Winner (\$250 award);
- Maria Acevedo, from Miami Senior High School Second Place Winner (\$150 award); and

PSA Contest:
