Florida State Statute 1001.42 and the State of Florida's Differentiated Accountability program require that schools develop and implement School Improvement Plans (SIPs) which include specific strategies to improve student performance and address educational priorities.

In 2014-2015, 348 Miami-Dade County Public Schools (including 5 Vocational Centers/Adult Education Centers, 4 Specialized Centers, 7 Alternative Schools, and 9 centers which completed the Department of Juvenile Justice SIP) and 127 Charter Schools completed School Improvement Plans (SIPs) using the State of Florida's Bureau of School Improvement's online SIP template. The 2014-2015 School Improvement Plans were developed through a collaborative process which included approval by school-site Educational Excellence School Advisory Councils (EESACs), review and approval by review teams and District staff, and review and feedback of the schools in the lowest performing categories by the State Region Director (RED). Implementation will be monitored at all levels throughout the school year by the Office of School Improvement.
