Through structured leadership and commitment to their mission, PTA/PTSA's membership support access and opportunity by speaking on behalf of children and youth in schools and community, and before governmental agencies and organizations that make decisions affecting children; assist parents in developing skills needed to raise and protect their children; and encourage parent and public involvement in our schools. This year, the PTSA team of officers plan to secure funding to outfit a playground with agility, balance & core strength equipment for the intermediate grades, supplement the current teacher-run Art Club for grades 4-5 with a volunteer-run Art Club for younger grades, build a small Lemonade Stand for children to engage in practical application of counting money and making change, encourage and reward creativity through the first annual CRE LEGO Brick Fair, and introduce the Run Club operated by parent volunteers during the first annual Healthy Kids Week.

From the school naming to securing sports activities for students, they have remained diligent in advocating for the most effective educational environment. In line with their belief in training and preparing students for leadership opportunities, the PTSA has had a student liaison each year since its inception and, this year a student has been elected to a Vice Presidential position. Last year, funds were allotted to send four students and two adults to the Florida State PTA Leadership Conference and, as a result, one of the students became a member of the State Student Involvement Committee and spent her time this year facilitating conference presentations. Additionally, the Cutler Bay PTSA awarded a scholarship to a student facing financial hardships so they may participate in extra-curricular activities and organized a shoe drive to benefit Haitian families. To enhance community outreach, speaking engagements on relevant topics such as college preparation, driving safety and brain development were organized for the benefit of parents and students. All members of this PTSA's Executive Board demonstrate great concern for the education community beyond their own school and have been selected to serve on the District and School Budget Priorities Parent Committee, Cutler Bay's Educational Compact Advisory Committee, Cutler Bay's Educational Advisory Committee, Cutler Bay's Youth Council Advisory Committee, as well as in county and state PTA positions.
