Four Lincoln-Marti charter schools' financial statements, initially presented at the January 26, 2016 meeting, were tabled until the March 15, 2016 meeting to allow the schools' administration to provide more documentation. After extensive review of the financial statements and additional related documentation, and discussions with the schools' representatives, OMCA's firm position remains that the financial statements submitted are not in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. As a result, the schools' revenues and fund balances as of June 30, 2015 were overstated by \$1,096,679, which is the amount of certain contributions made to the schools on August 17, 2015 by two contributing entities. OMCA requested that the schools restate and reissue their financial statements to correct the overstatement of revenues and fund balances. Although the schools representatives' position is that restatement and reissuance are not necessary, pursuant to the advice of the successor independent auditor, they committed to changing their revenue recognition policy, prospectively, to avoid a similar situation in the future.

Regarding the four Lincoln-Marti schools' financials, the Committee voted to transmit them to the School Board, with two members abstaining, and two members voting against transmittal.

The Academy of Arts and Minds Charter High School, now known as B.A.A.M., presented a corrective action plan, which in the opinion of the Chief Auditor and his staff members, is realistic. That plan, forwarded to the Florida Department of Education in accordance with state statutes, is pending approval.
