The voter guide, which launched February 1st, the day of the Iowa Caucuses, is full of information taken from more than 500 sources, including Project Vote Smart, Politifact, each candidate's official campaign website, quotes and debate transcripts. The data is divided into 13 policy areas, including immigration, the environment and gun control.
