**SUBJECT: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD POLICY: FINAL
 READING 5120, *STUDENT SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT AND*
 ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY COMMITTEE**

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on April 13, 2016, its intention to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting of June 22, 2016.

The Attendance Boundary Committee is recommending the following:

- The final implementation of a district-wide non-boundary magnet at Miami Arts Studio 6-12 @ Zelda Glazer.
- Establish new attendance boundaries for Lamar Louise Curry Middle School.
- Establish new attendance boundaries for W.R. Thomas Middle School.
- Establish the utilization of the Bowman Foster Ashe/Doolin K-8 Primary Learning Center (PLC) to serve as a relief for Christina M. Eve Elementary School. The addition of the PLC to Christina M. Eve Elementary School will increase student stations at the school, as well as provide an opportunity for the school to expand the Pre-K program. Christina M. Eve Elementary School's boundary includes vast areas of undeveloped land with a large potential for residential development and future students.
- Establish new attendance boundaries for Bob Graham Education Center.
- Establish new attendance boundaries for Hialeah Gardens Elementary School.
- Establish new attendance boundaries for Primary Learning Center at the former MacArthur North location.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on April 18, 2016, posted in various places for public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended policy and to individuals requesting notification.

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The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this policy has elapsed.

In accordance with provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this amended policy is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the policy in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached is the Notice of Intended Action and the policy proposed for amendment. Changes from the current policy are indicated by underscoring words to be added and ~~striking through~~ words to be deleted.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on April 13, 2016, its intention to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting of June 22, 2016.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish attendance zones for elementary and secondary schools for the 2016-2017 school year, which are in the best interest of students and better utilize existing student stations.

SUMMARY: Board approval of this policy would support previously approved attendance zones and subsequently establishes all Board-approved attendance zones as a Board policy.

SPECIFIC LEGAL AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH RULEMAKING IS AUTHORIZED: 1001.41(1) (2); 1001.42(25); 1001.43(10) F.S.

LAW IMPLEMENTED, INTERPRETED, OR MADE SPECIFIC: 1000.05; 1001.41; 1001.49; 1002.20; 1002.31; 1003.02, 1003.06, 1003.21 F.S.

IF REQUESTED, A HEARING WILL BE HELD DURING THE BOARD MEETING of June 22, 2016, which begins at 1:00 p.m., in the School Board Administration Building, School Board Auditorium, 1450 N. E. Second Avenue, Miami, Florida 33132. Persons requesting such a hearing or who wish to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided by Section 120.541(1), F.S., must do so in writing by May 9, 2016, to the Superintendent of Schools, Room 912, at the same address.

ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. (Section 286.0105, Florida Statutes)

7 Copies of these documents are incorporated by reference in this policy and are on
8 file in the Office of Board Recording Secretary and in the Citizen Information Center.

9 No assignment to schools or attendance schedules shall discriminate against
10 students on the basis of gender, race, religion, disability, national origin, sex, color,
11 ethnic or national origin, marital status, genetic information, age, political beliefs,
12 sexual orientation, gender identification, social and family background, linguistic
13 preference, medical reason, pregnancy, childbirth, medical condition to pregnancy,
14 handicap, handicap against a student or employee, and any other legally prohibited
15 basis.

16 The parent of siblings who are assigned to the same grade level and school may
17 request that the school place the siblings in the same classroom or in separate
18 classrooms. This request must be made no later than five (5) days before the first
19 day of school each school year or five (5) days after the first day of attendance of the
20 students if the students are enrolled in school after the school year commences.
21 The school is not required to meet the request if there is factual evidence indicating
22 a specific placement is better for the student than that requested by the parent.

23 The Superintendent may assign a student to a school other than that designated by
24 the attendance area when such exception is justified by circumstances and is in the
25 best interest of the student.

26 Whenever school boundaries are revised, every effort shall be made to continue a
27 student in the elementary school to which s/he was initially assigned.

28 Wherever possible and advisable in the interests of students in non-magnet schools
29 and programs, siblings shall be assigned to the same school. Assignment of siblings
30 of students to magnet schools and programs is governed by Policy 2370.

31 The Superintendent shall assign incoming transfer students to schools, grades, and
32 classes that provide each student the greatest likelihood of realizing their fullest
33 educational potential.

1 The principal shall assign students in his/her school to appropriate grades, classes,
2 or groups. This action shall be based on consideration of the needs of the student
3 as well as the administration of the school.

4 **Request for Student Transfers**

5 A student may be permitted to attend a school other than the school serving the
6 parents' residential area as stipulated in Policy 5131.

7 **Nonresident Students**

8 Students who are not residents of Miami-Dade County may attend District schools
9 as stipulated in Policy 5131.
