SUBJECT: SCHOOL BOARD RECOGNITION OF THE 2016 WALKSAFE STATEWIDE POSTER CONTEST WINNERS

The WalkSafe program, a part of the KiDZ Neuroscience Center at the University Of Miami Miller School Of Medicine, was developed to improve pedestrian safety and health for elementary school children on a statewide level. The WalkSafe educational component involves a three-day curriculum, which is designed to teach students safe walking skills, and is taught to coincide with the annual Walk to School events during the month of October.

This year the WalkSafe educational curriculum reached close to 120,000 students from 217 public school classrooms across Miami-Dade County with its pedestrian safety lessons. During the 2016-2017 school year students learned about safe street-crossing behaviors, traffic and pedestrian signs and signals, and the health benefits of walking daily. In addition to the curriculum, the WalkSafe team also hosted its annual Statewide Poster Contest to encourage students to promote key pedestrian safety lessons learned from the three-day educational program.

This year, the contest was very competitive with over 130 submissions from 70 elementary schools and K-8 Centers from Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, and Orange counties. Adjudication of the posters was conducted by the KiDZ Neuroscience Center.
