The mission of Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) is to motivate young people to become better citizens. The program teaches seven army values, which include loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity and personal courage.

The program prepares high school students for leadership roles while making them aware of their rights, responsibilities, and privileges as American citizens. It is a stimulus for promoting graduation from high school and it provides instruction and rewarding opportunities, which will benefit the student, community, and nation.

The JROTC at North Miami Beach Senior High School was established in 2001. Under the leadership of retired Major Michael Rountree, Sergeant First Class's Peter Serrano, Sergeant First Class Franklin Marquez as the Army instructors, and Principal Randy Milliken, the program has experienced tremendous growth and success. The program has 272 students, and 60 of them participate on one or more of the teams such as the Drill, Raiders, Academic or Leadership teams.

On April 1, 2017 in Louisville, Kentucky, North Miami Beach Senior High School's Female Unarmed Division of JROTC won first place overall in the 2017 U.S. Army National Drill Competition. The platoon included:

The Lady Chargers placed in all the events in the 2017 Army Nationals Unarmed division, winning the overall championship. The final results were first place in the Unarmed Inspection, second place in the Unarmed Regulation, second place in Unarmed color guard, and third place in Unarmed Exhibition.
