Her name is Tawana Akins. She has been honored for her academic, social, and community efforts since elementary school. She became the multiplication champ in third grade, Ms. 7th and 8th grade runner up in middle school, and in high school F.E.A. President, Class President, and graduated Number 5 in the 1994 class of Cope Center North. Despite having a child at 15, Ms. Akins still graduated on time and even was awarded with a plaque and \$100 from her former principal who is now deceased Dr. William Perry. Ms. Akins really thinks that parenthood should have been postponed until marriage, but it happened and she is grateful for her child and now granddaughter Milani Mattea.

Ms. Akins would become known as the "Diamond in the Rough at Cope." Many teachers believed in her ability but she couldn't understand why she had to go to college. In the face of raising a child as a single parent, Ms. Akins took on various jobs to support her child and not to depend on a system that's intended to help but more often fails individuals. She had an AHA! Moment and decided that she would just go to school and be a lawyer. She didn't accept her scholarship and now was forced to take out loans which she regrets to this day. A change of heart and circumstances landed her at the School of Education at Florida Memorial University. She went on to receive four college degrees since then and is in her 15th year of teaching with NO ABSENCES. She has earned spots on the President's List, Dean's List and also graduated Cum Laude. She holds a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education (Florida Memorial), Master's Degree in Reading (Florida Memorial), Specialist Degree in Curriculum and Instruction with a minor specialization in Special Education (Barry University), ESOL Endorsement, and Educational Leadership (Barry University).

She is also a Mentor to new teachers. She was Steward of the Year finalist twice and also an elected delegate with the United Teachers of Dade. She recently became the Education Transformation Office Region Teacher of the Year in which she was awarded with cash, plaque, and a trophy. Her community service dates far back as an elementary student. She's one of the known community/ social justice activists in Liberty City.

She is the founder of "A Better ME" mentoring group that targets at risk males in five areas: Overtown, Liberty City, Brown n Sub, Miami Gardens, and Opa Locka. She is also the co-founder of a seafood and BBQ restaurant in Liberty City (Chill and Grill Smokehouse) 1807 NW 79 St. The author of three books, Ms. Akins is a force to be reckoned with: The titles of the books are: "A Better Me!", Milani's First Day of school and Transformation, and Miraculous, Meticulous, Milani Mattea. Ms. Akins does countless other things while being a mother to Shaprell and a Glammy (as she says) to her granddaughter Milani Mattea as well as spending time with her family. She is the Transformational Math Coach at Holmes Elementary and an aspiring future administrator.
