At its May 14, 2019, meeting, the School Board Audit and Budget Advisory Committee (the Committee or ABAC) was presented with the June 30, 2018, certified financial statements of 21 charter schools and transmitted them to the School Board.

This is the last group of charter schools to be presented to the ABAC this year. These are the certified financial statements of 21 charter schools for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018. Not included in this group is one charter school that closed at the end of FY 2017-18 and the certified financial statements have not been submitted to the District. The audit is pending. According to the school representatives, they are trying to obtain funds to hire an external auditor to perform the audit.

Of the 21 charter schools in this group, 14 did not disclose any financial issues. Regarding the remaining seven charter schools, although not meeting the condition of a financial emergency or a deteriorating financial condition, six experienced a deficit net position.

In addition, three of these six charter schools received a management letter finding regarding: 1) documentation not presented to the external auditors as well as the matter of the deficit fund balance; 2) issues with the documentation and authorization of certain journal entries that have not been fully corrected as of this audit; or 3) the fact that the school reported a deficit net position. The remaining school did not disclose issues with the financial statements; however, the external auditor included a management letter finding because of missing and unsigned cash collection forms in the deposit process, and these forms not always reconciling to the bank deposit receipt.
