In Miami-Dade County, there is a law that prohibits dogs from roaming free. The Miami-Dade Animal Services Department enforces this law by picking up stray dogs. However, since there is no such law for cats, Animal Services does not pick up stray cats.

Community members together with Miami-Dade County Animal Services have been applying the Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program as a form of animal control since 2012. In a TNR program community cats are humanely trapped, brought to a veterinarian to be fixed (spayed or neutered), ear-tipped (the universal sign that a cat is fixed), and then returned to their outdoor home.

Despite the efforts of Miami-Dade County Animal Services and their volunteers, our office has been made aware of alleged instances where a private animal control agency has treated cats inhumanely, using loopholes to remove and dispose of cats despite federal and state laws.

Since Miami-Dade County Animal Services is the primary agency responsible for animal control they should be the entity contacted to remove cats from any Miami-Dade Public Schools (M-DCPS) facility. Consequently, private vendors must not be used for removal of feral or stray cats.

ACTION PROPOSED BY MS. SUSIE V. CASTILLO:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- Review current procedures regarding stray animals on M-DCPS property and ensure that Miami-Dade County Animal Services is the primary agency contacted for the removal of cats, when necessary;
- 2. Ensure principals and site administrators are advised of proper procedures for removal of animals from District properties; and
- 3. Report back to the Board by the December 11, 2019 School Board Meeting.
