The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on October 2, 2019 its intention to amend the document, *Student Progression Plan 2018-2019* and to promulgate the new document, *Student Progression Plan 2019-2020*. The amendment reflects actions by the Florida Legislature and the School Board. Additional changes have been made to incorporate current District procedures and enter new language, as appropriate.

Any changes that would have an impact on the *Student Progression Plan 2019-2020* based upon future interpretations or clarification of legislation by the Florida Department of Education will be communicated to appropriate staff by means of memoranda.

Highlights of amendments to the *Student Progression Plan 2019-2020* include:

- The 2019 Florida legislative session changes regarding student progression and graduation requirements from House Bill 7071 as follows:
 - Establishes the Career and Technical Education (CTE) graduation pathway
 as an alternative pathway option for students to earn a standard high school
 diploma; and requires students to earn a 2.0 grade point average,
 successfully complete at least 18 credits in specified subject areas, and
 fulfill the statewide, standardized assessment requirements to receive a
 standard high school diploma. (Florida Statutes § 1003.4282)

- Modifies the 24-credit pathway for earning a standard high school diploma by revising computer science credit substitution for mathematics or science credits; and eliminates the financial literacy credit requirement, as part of economics under the specified social studies credits. (Florida Statutes § 1003.4282)
- Revises the requirements for a student to earn a "Scholar" designation by permitting the one credit in Algebra II to be substituted with one credit in another equally rigorous course. (Florida Statutes § 1003.4285)
- Restores middle grades career education and planning course requiring middle school students to take a career and education planning course for promotion to high school. (Florida Statutes § 1003.4156)

The Notice of Intended Action is attached and was published in the Miami Daily Business Review on October 7, 2019, posted in various places for public information, and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the policy and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this policy has elapsed.

In accordance with provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this policy is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the policy in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Changes to the updated *Student Progression Plan 2019-2020* are the result of actions by the Florida Legislature, interpretations or clarifications by the Florida Department of Education of statutes, or Florida Board of Education rules related to student progression.

SUMMARY: The document establishes the requirements and procedures for student progression within Miami-Dade County Public Schools. These procedures are related to student progression, retention, and special placement for grades K-12 and adult. ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is based. (Section 286.0105, Florida Statutes)
