SUBJECT: <u>FINAL READING</u>: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD POLICY 5120, STUDENT SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT AND ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY COMMITTEE

COMMITTEE: PERSONNEL, STUDENT, SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

The School Board of Miami-Dade County Florida, announced on April 29, 2020, its intention to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting on June 17, 2020.

The Attendance Boundary Committee is recommending the following:

- Establish new boundaries for Dr. Toni Bilbao Preparatory Academy for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Establish new boundaries for Dr. Rolando Espinosa K-8 Center for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Boundaries will remain the same for Eugenia B. Thomas K-8 Center which will now be assigned to the New High School Doral feeder pattern for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Boundaries will remain the same for John I. Smith K-8 Center which will now be assigned to the New High School Doral feeder pattern for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Establish new boundaries for Ronald W. Reagan/Doral Senior High School for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Establish new boundaries for New High School Doral for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Establish new boundaries for New K-8 Center Doral for the 2020-2021 school year.

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The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on May 5, 2020, posted in various places for the public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended policy and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption has elapsed.

In accordance with provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this amended policy is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the policy in the official records of the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached is the Notice of Intended Action and the policy proposed for amendment. Changes from the current policy are indicated by <u>underscoring</u> the words to be added and striking through words to be deleted.

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on April 29, 2020, its intention to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting of June 17, 2020.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish attendance zones for elementary and secondary schools for the 2020-2021 school year which are in the best interest of students and better utilize existing student stations.

SUMMARY: Board approval of this policy would support previously approved attendance boundary zones and subsequently establishes all Board-approved attendance zones as a Board policy.

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STUDENT SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT AND ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY COMMITTEE

3 The assignment of students to District schools shall be consistent with the best 4 interests of students and the best use of District resources.

5 Attendance Areas 2019-2020-2020-2021

6 The Superintendent is responsible for proposing attendance areas for District 7 schools. The Superintendent will be assisted in this task by School Operations, the 8 Office of School Facilities, and the Attendance Boundary Committee (ABC).

9 The Offices of School Facilities and School Operations will provide the Attendance 10 Boundary Committee and the community with proposed attendance boundary changes for schools in 2019-20202020-2021. Community input on these boundary 11 12 changes will be solicited at regional community meetings. Individuals who wish to 13 present alternate recommendations will be assisted by region staff. Any alternate proposals must be reviewed through the same process as the Superintendent's 14 15 proposals. Community and ABC meetings will be held to present the attendance 16 boundaries established for 2019-20202020-2021. The Superintendent is authorized 17 to develop administrative procedures to implement this process.

18 The ABC will take the following factors into consideration when reviewing proposed 19 attendance areas regarding school boundaries: compliance with class size reduction 20 mandate, impact on special education programs, use of available student stations 21 within contiguous areas, degree and extent of transportation, programmatic impact 22 due to lack of student housing, reduction of the number of schools students must 23 attend, integrity of feeder systems, assignment of students from new residential 24 developments to specific schools prior to completion of developments, construction of new schools, promotion and maintenance of diverse school enrollments, and 25 prevention, reduction or elimination of racial isolation to the extent practicable. 26

policy

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1 Staff in School Operations, Office of School Facilities, Information Technology 2 Services, Department of Transportation, Research Services, Office of Diversity 3 Compliance, and Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, Grants Administration and 4 Community Engagement, will assist the Superintendent in providing data, analyze 5 proposed attendance areas, and prepare recommendations for submission to the 6 School Board.

- 7 The Board-approved school attendance zones for the current school year are 8 contained in the following documents:

- A. Attendance Zones Previously Approved by the Board 2018-20192019-2020;
- 11B.Attendance Zone Recommendations and Related Administrative12Actions 2019-20202020-2021.
- 13 Copies of these documents are incorporated by reference in this policy and are on 14 file in the Office of Board Recording Secretary and in the Citizen Information Center.

No assignment to schools or attendance schedules shall discriminate against students on the basis of gender, race, religion, disability, national origin, sex, color, ethnic or national origin, marital status, genetic information, age, political beliefs, sexual orientation, gender identification, social and family background, linguistic preference, medical reason, pregnancy, childbirth, medical condition to pregnancy, handicap, handicap against a student or employee, and any other legally prohibited basis.

The parent of siblings who are assigned to the same grade level and school may request that the school place the siblings in the same classroom or in separate classrooms. This request must be made no later than five (5) days before the first day of school each school year or five (5) days after the first day of attendance of the students if the students are enrolled in school after the school year commences. The school is not required to meet the request if there is factual evidence indicating a specific placement is better for the student than that requested by the parent.

29 The Superintendent may assign a student to a school other than that designated by

30 the attendance area when such exception is justified by circumstances and is in the

31 best interest of the student.



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- 1 Whenever school boundaries are revised, every effort shall be made to continue a 2 student in the elementary school to which s/he was initially assigned.
- 3 Wherever possible and advisable in the interests of students in non-magnet schools
- 4 and programs, siblings shall be assigned to the same school. Assignment of siblings
- 5 of students to magnet schools and programs is governed by Policy 2370.
- 6 The Superintendent shall assign incoming transfer students to schools, grades, and 7 classes that provide each student the greatest likelihood of realizing their fullest 8 educational potential.
- 9 The principal shall assign students in his/her school to appropriate grades, classes,
- 10 or groups. This action shall be based on consideration of the needs of the student 11 as well as the administration of the school.

12 **Request for Student Transfers**

13 A student may be permitted to attend a school other than the school serving the 14 parents' residential area as stipulated in Policy 5131.



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1 Nonresident Students

- 2 Students who are not residents of Miami-Dade County may attend District schools
- 3 as stipulated in Policy 5131.
