- Dates and times vary by program



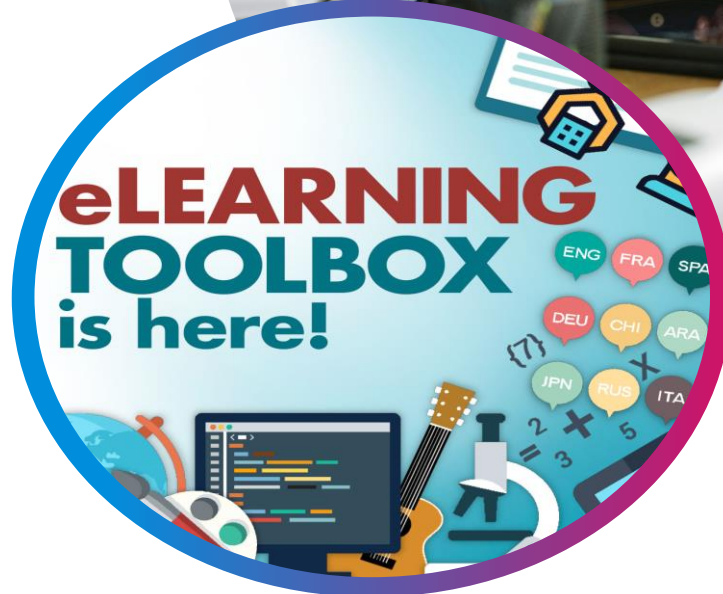

SMART START ELEMENTARY SUMMER CAMP

- Designed for rising 1st – 5th grade students
- Build and strengthen math and reading foundations
- Include SEL time
- Incorporate STEAM Challenges for cross-curricular applications daily
- Deliver personalized, small-group lessons
- Scaffold and integrate ESOL and ESE strategies
- June 23 – July 21, 8:30 a.m. – 1:50 p.m.
- Before/After school care will be provided



ADVENTURE BACKPACK PROGRAM

HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START

- Early Head Start (EHS) – Currently enrolled birth to 3-year-old students continue receiving instruction and services through July 27, 2022.
- Head Start (HS) - Currently enrolled 3 to 5-year-old HS students may participate in the federally funded HS Summer Program at selected schools from June 23 – July 21.
- Eligible students will be prioritized based on Enrollment Priority Report provided.

ALGEBRA I

Two types:

- Credit Recovery
 - In-person, teacher-directed
 - Recommended for students who have not passed the Algebra I course but may have passed the EOC
- Online, self-paced
 - Available all summer
 - Recommended for students who have not passed the Algebra I EOC but passed the course

ACT/SAT PREP HOME CONNECTIONS

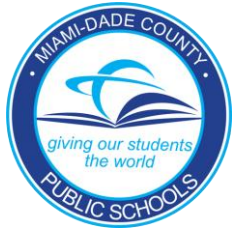
