The National Day of Prayer is an annual day of observance held on the first Thursday of May, designated by the United States Congress. National Day of Prayer, which this year falls on Thursday, May 5, 2022, calls on all people of different faiths in the United States to pray for the nation, and its leaders.

On June 17, 1952, in a Joint Resolution of Congress, President Harry Truman signed a bill proclaiming the National Day of Prayer into law in the United States. President Ronald W. Reagan approved an amendment in 1988, designating the first Thursday of May each year as the National Day of Prayer.

The National Prayer Committee was established in the United States in 1972. It went on to create the National Day of Prayer Task Force, with the intended purpose of coordinating events for the National Day of Prayer. According to the Legal Information Institute, the President shall issue a proclamation each year designating the first Thursday in May as a National Day of Prayer on which the people of the United States may engage in prayer and meditation at houses of worship, in groups, and as individuals.

This agenda item seeks the Board's approval to recognize and acknowledge Thursday, May 5, 2022, as the National Day of Prayer, and direct the Superintendent to inform all schools and District staff to support any Board policies, practices, and curricula that respect and encourage students and staff's recognition of the National Day of Prayer.
