District 9's Office Student Fellowship is an opportunity for students to use their voices and lived experiences to be changemakers in the Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) system while developing professionally. High school and college students can join or lead one of four teams: Policy, Communications, Relational Organizing, and People Operations. The mission of the program is to equip a group of students that mirrors the diversity of the M-DCPS community with the knowledge and skills to effectuate change while building an inclusive and equity-centered program where students' voices are amplified.

During the inaugural class, Class I, fellows built the Student Fellowship from the ground up. From helping create office maxims to establishing core activities, these fellows were instrumental in creating a vision for the Fellowship, developing every part of this impactful program, and creating a community of mission-driven students.

As the fellowship progressed, returning fellows evaluated their previous experiences and helped determine what elements should continue in the program. Through their work, fellows gained skills such as project management, people management, time management, stress management, and effective communication. Fellows and team leads were also integral in developing the sense of community and expectation of excellence within the Fellowship. Co-leads have attested that the fellowship created a culture that allowed for unity, unconditional support, personal bonds, and task efficiency.

Over the course of the first three classes, fellows researched and drafted two successful M-DCPS Board items, tracked over 200 state legislative bills, connected with over 800 constituents via the Office's Listening Campaign, staffed over twenty of School Board Member Santos' engagements, drafted over 400 congratulatory letters, grew and maintained the office's social media presence, prepared Ms. Santos for press events and School Board Meetings, and hosted over forty fellowship-wide meetings that provided professional development and meaningful opportunities to connect with community leaders, such as Senator Jason Pizzo and State Representatives Vance Aloupis and Dotie Joseph.
