Mr. Michael Putney was born in New York City, and was raised in St. Louis, Missouri. At the age of 14, he and his family moved to Berkeley, California, where he attended Berkeley High School and upon graduating, he attended Deep Springs College in California for two years. He went on to earn a Bachelor of Arts Degree in English literature and a Master’s degree from the University of Missouri.

Mr. Putney began his career in broadcast journalism in 1966 while a graduate student, first as a radio reporter and then as a news director at KCGM in Columbia, Missouri. He transferred across town to KFRU radio and was quickly promoted from assistant news director to news director. Between newscasts, he worked for *The Columbia Daily News* as city editor. In 1970, he moved to Washington, D.C. to work for *The National Observer* as a general arts writer, and then ultimately worked his way up to becoming general assignment reporter and national feature writer.

His television career in Miami, Florida, began in 1981 at WTVJ, which at the time was broadcasting on Channel 4 as Miami’s CBS network affiliate. At Channel 4, he worked as a reporter emphasizing on government and politics, eventually becoming weekend co-anchor in 1986. In 1989, he moved to WPLG Channel 10, an ABC network affiliate in Miami, to become senior political reporter and host of “This Week in South Florida with Michael Putney.” He also continued writing semi-regular columns for *The Miami Herald* throughout his career. By the late 1980’s and early 1990’s, Mr. Putney had achieved “most valuable reporter” status in the South Florida broadcast community. His superior reporting skills have won him two Emmys and the State Supreme Court also appointed him to the Florida’s Judicial Management Council.
