June 6, 2024, marked the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of Operation Overlord, which was launched by the unprecedented D-Day landings on the beaches of Normandy during World War II. This operation concentrated the land, sea, and air forces of twelve allied nations in a high-stakes invasion of Nazi-occupied France.

During World War II all American men between the ages of 21 and 45 had to register for the draft. By 1944 fifty million had registered and ten million had been inducted into the military. Draft numbers for men in their forties were being called by 1944 as the military ramped up for the European invasion.

In May 1944, the Western Allies were ready for the long-delayed cross-channel invasion of northern France, code-named Overlord. General Dwight D. Eisenhower was supreme commander of the operation that coordinated the efforts of twelve nations.

Surprise was an essential element of the Allied invasion plan. If the Germans had known where and when the Allies were approaching, they would have hurled them back into the sea with the fifty-five divisions they had in France. The Allies would have been on the offensive with a 10-to-1 manpower ratio against them.

The Nazis had spent months constructing the Atlantic Wall, a 2,400-mile line of obstacles. This defensive wall comprised 6.5 million mines, thousands of concrete bunkers and pillboxes containing heavy and fast-firing artillery, tens of thousands of tank ditches and other formidable beach obstacles.

Mr. James Weir, or as his friends refer to him, Pap-pap, grew up in Mount Pleasant, Pennsylvania, near Pittsburgh. He enlisted into the United States Navy in August of 1943. He fought on behalf of our nation, in Europe and Asia. On June 6, 1944, Mr. Weir crossed the English Channel aboard a Landing Craft Tanks (Amphibious) to deliver tanks and troops onto the beaches of Normandy. After the battle was won in Europe, Mr. Weir fought in the liberation of the Philippines, and was deployed to Japan as part of the occupational forces after the war.

In-between those momentous historical events, Mr. Weir was granted a twenty day leave after D-Day. He rushed back to the states to marry his sweetheart, Laverne Myers. They had been sweethearts since he sat behind her in sixth grade. They were married for 73 years. Laverne passed away in 2018.

After the war, Mr. Weir worked as a master electrician and was a renowned Corvette racer, leading the national Corvette Club as its President. Mr. Weir now lives in Miami, Florida., He has two grandchildren and six great grandchildren who love him dearly. He lives with his granddaughter Lisa and her family.
